

#### **DIRECTIONS TO THE KENTUCKY BUILDING FOR THE APRIL 21, 2011 MEETING:**

The Kentucky Building is located on Western's campus not far from Cherry Hall (our first meeting place). It is located in the 1400 block of Kentucky Street. Visitor parking lots are on the left and right. The Kentucky Building which houses both the Kentucky Library and the Kentucky Museum is located on the right side of the street. There are also brown visitor signs directing you to this location.

#### Southbound I-65

- 1. From I-65 South take Exit 28 towards Bowling Green (US-31W)
- 2. Merge on to KY 446W
- 3. Take US-31S ramp towards Bowling Green
- 4. Merge on to US-31W/US-68/KY-80W (Louisville Road)
- 5. Follow US-68W/KY-80W (Adams Street) into Bowling Green
- 6. Just past 14<sup>th</sup> Street, on the left, make a left hand U-turn at the traffic island on Kentucky Street.
- 7. The Kentucky Building is located to your right and you may park in the adjoining lots.

#### Northbound I-65

- 1. From I-65 North take Exit 20 onto the William Natcher Parkway
- 2. Take Exit 4, Turn right onto US-31W (Nashville Road)
- 3. Follow US-31W to Bowling Green
- 4. Turn left onto US-231 (University Blvd) Go thru three lights, you will pass the WKU football and baseball complexes.
- 5. Follow University Blvd to the Kentucky Building located in the 1400 block of KY street. Visitor parking lots are on the left and right. The Kentucky Building is 4 miles from exit 4.
