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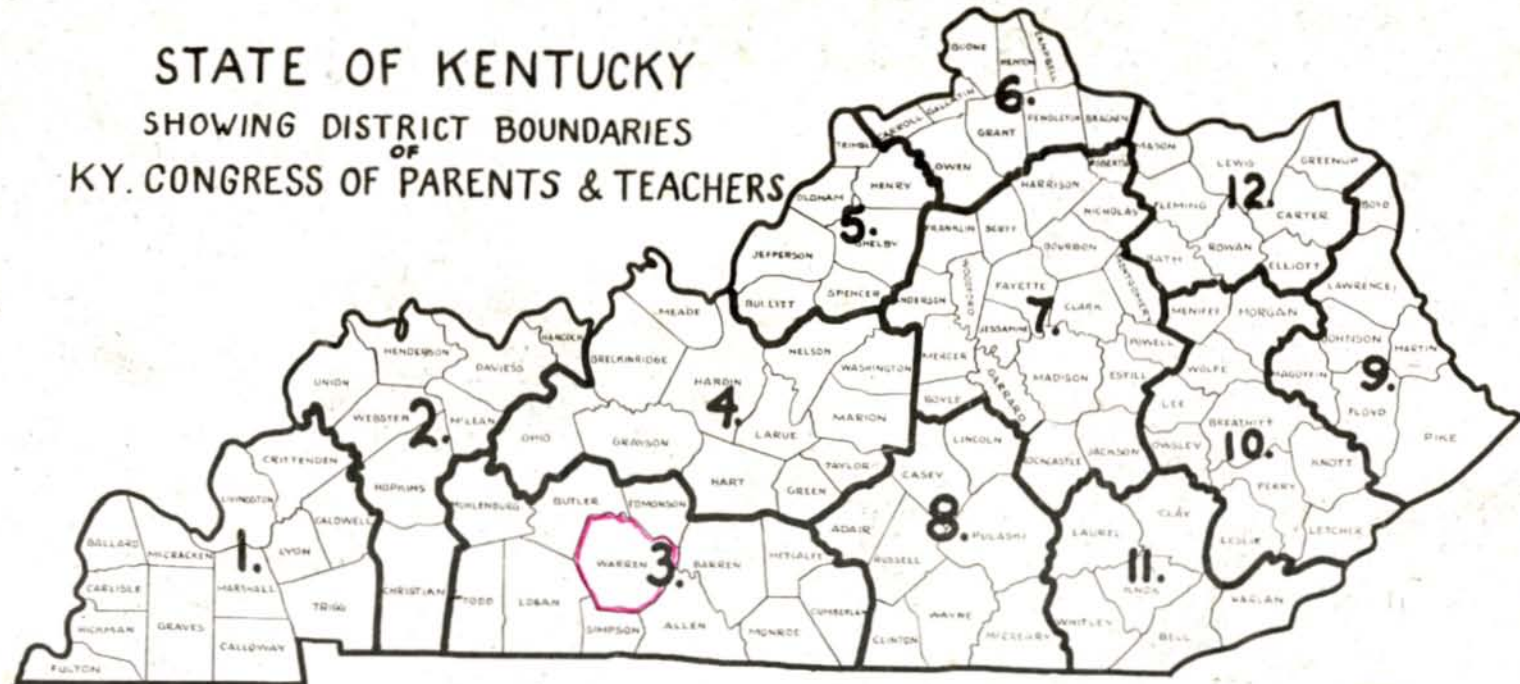

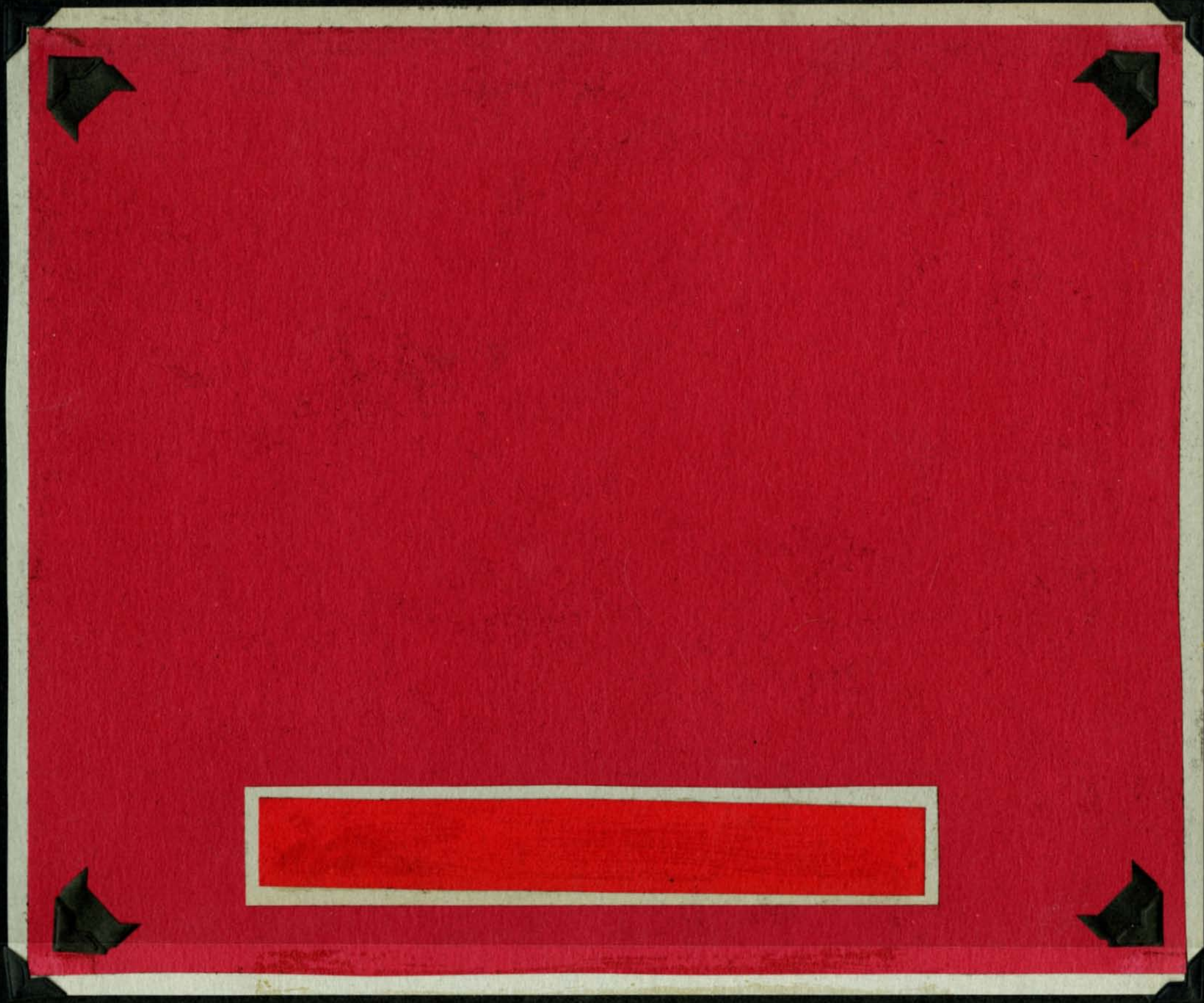

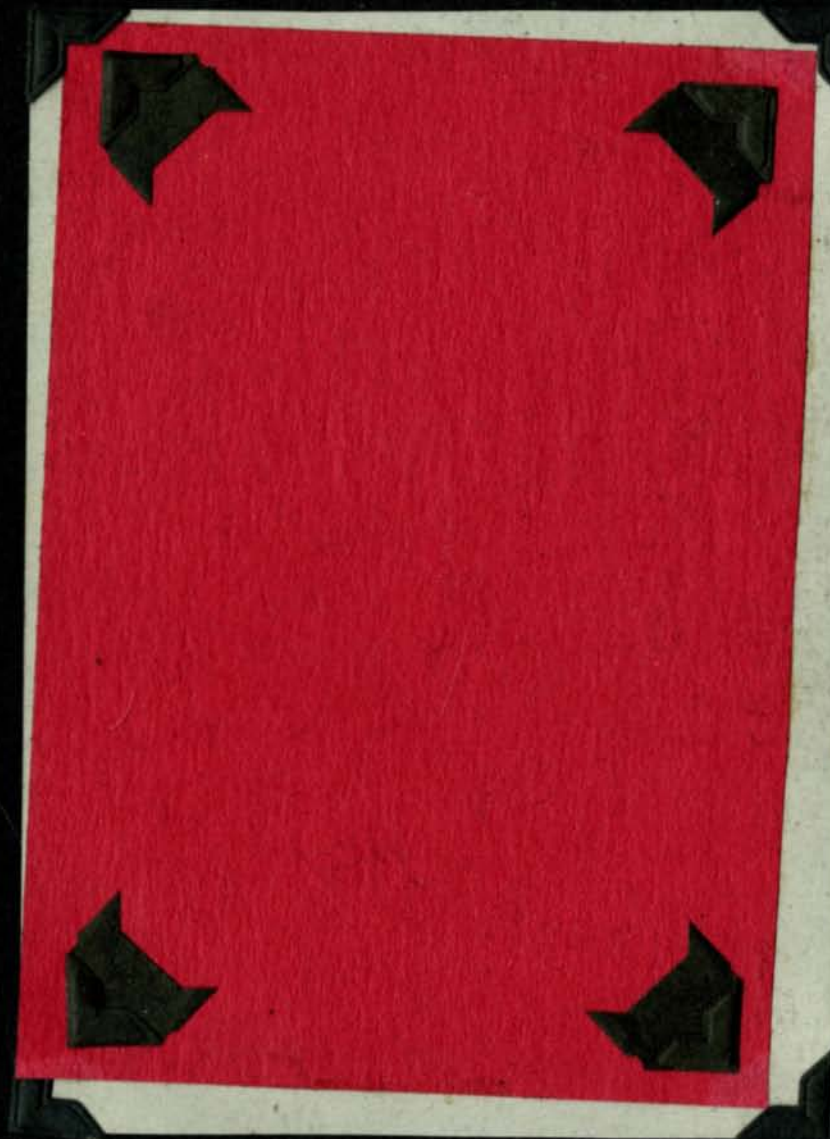

Western State College and its Training School will end their 1953-54 semesters this week with graduation activities.

Both schools will hold baccalaureate services today, the Training School at 4 p.m. at Cumberland Presbyterian Church and Western at 8 p.m. at Van Meter Auditorium.

The Rev. Hinkley Smartt, pastor of Cumberland Church, will deliver the baccalaureate sermon to the high school class and the Rev. Paul S. Stauffer, pastor of First Christian Church, Louisville, will be the speaker at the college program.

Most local churches are dismissing tonight's services in favor of the college baccalaureate.

At 7:30 p.m. tomorrow at the Kentucky Building, the 36 graduating seniors at the Training School will be guests at a reception given by the school's Parent-Teacher Association. The Alumni Association dinner will be at 7 p.m. Tuesday at State Street Methodist Church and Class Day exercises are set for 10 a.m. Wednesday at the Little Theater.
