every candidate for a State office from the Governor down for whom I voted was nominated by the democratic party. It was the ugliest ,bitterest, meanest political fight ever made in the history of Kentucky. This is saying a good deal when we consider some of the former battles in our State. I entertain that the final fight in November with the Republicans and Democrats will be a bitter one and that the Democrats will have a full job to elect the ticket. Everything has been mot satisfactory as far as I am personally concerned until now. Of course, the final battle will come in the November election. I reached hom two weeks prior to the August primary and witnessed, as I have said above, the meanest political fight ever known in the State. I am very happy over the result , however, and am hoping everything will work out splendidly in the final election.
