My dear Brother and Family:

I am sending to you under separate wrapper a copy of this year's Talisman. I am also inclosing two autographed photos of myself. The Annual this year is not quite as large as the one last year. It was necessary to reduce the size in order to reduce the expense as this proposition is always hard to finance. I have been thinking a great deal about all of you. I still wish it had been possible for me to have spent two weeks at Eminence and at the Lake. I would have enjoyed every minute of it and besides it would have been good for me.

I think I have about recovered from the trouble with my ears, notwithstanding I have had very serious trouble with them and have had them lanced several times since returning home. I believe now I am entirely over the trouble.

Concerning the political situation will say every candidate for a State office from the Governor down for whom I voted was nominated by the democratic party. It was the ugliest, bitterest, meanest political fight ever made in the history of Kentucky. This is saying a good deal when we consider some of the former battles in our State. I entertain that the final fight in November with the Republicans and Democrats will be a bitter one and that the Democrats will have a full job to elect the ticket. Everything has been most satisfactory as far as I am personally concerned until now. Of course, the final battle will come in the November election. I reached home two weeks prior to the August primary and witnessed, as I have said above, the meanest political fight ever known in the State. I am very happy over the result, however, and am hoping everything will work out splendidly in the final election.

Brother T.C. and family are well. We are closing school for the year today. All of the folks are enjoying the best of health. Hosophine and her Husband are with us for vacation.
