COLLECTION NOTE

The bulk of this collection consists of photocopies of eight albums of letters sent to students at Jessamine County Middle School in Nicholasville, Kentucky, from soldiers serving in the Persian Gulf War (referred to as Operation Desert Storm prior to 1991). The majority of the letters were sent by soldiers serving in Saudi Arabia. The students wrote letters to the soldiers, but only a few of the student letters are included in the collection. The albums, or scrapbooks, also contain newspaper clippings about the war.

The project was headed by Jessamine County Middle School teacher, Melinda D. Lewis. The project started when Ms. Lewis created a writing project for her classes that involved writing letters to her cousin, Timothy Cassell, who was serving in Saudi Arabia as a Special Forces Green Beret Sergeant. The first 130 letters drafted by the students were sent to Cassell at the rate of one per day. The middle schoolers also sent an American flag and other items of support. The school supported the project in a big way, and eventually each student adopted a soldier and wrote to him; the number of soldiers who were sent letters eventually totaled 1,418. The project received widespread media attention, and copies of articles related to the endeavor are included in the collection. The letters from soldiers discuss military life—both the excitement and the boredom—and ask questions about the lives of the students. They also answer inquiries made by the students in their letters. The collection also includes several videos related to the project, including one of three soldiers, who had received letters, visiting with students at Jessamine County Middle School.

The collection also contains several videos, one of which includes some of the soldiers visiting Jessamine County Middle School.
