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More On Main Street.....

Many different types of rehabilitation projects have taken place as a result of Bowling Green's Main Street Program. Involvement in 46 rehabilitation projects and four new construction projects in the district has amounted to over \$8 million in capital investments. These rehabilitations include technical assistance from Landmark for 29 facade designs, 44 exterior rehabilitations, 39 interior rehabilitations, 25 signage improvements and 16 awning improvements. Twenty certified Tax Act applications and six non-certified projects have been completed to provide tax incentives for rehabilitations.
