ORGANIZATIONAL HISTORY

The Child Evangelism Fellowship of Warren County, Kentucky, was a nondenominational organization affiliated with the International Child Evangelism Fellowship. It was organized in December 1947 by Dorothy Robinson and Lucy Nethercott of Michigan. Robinson and her assistant, Mary Lou Norgaard, began on-site work in September 1948.

The purpose of the organization was to evangelize boys and girls and to work along side other Christian churches and agencies to begin Bible study classes for children. Within two years of its commencement, the ministry was operating six Bible study classes, known as Good News Clubs, with an enrollment of 229; the largest class was located in the Delafield section of the city. In late 1948 Robinson began leadership training courses at several locations in Bowling Green. In 1949 Norgaard went on to lead a similar effort in Lexington. Robinson stayed until 1957. By that time she was hosting a 15-minute radio show on WLBJ (The Christian Radio Bible Club), and was leading seven classes with an enrollment of 312.

Miss Robinson's other activities included Vacation Bible Schools, Bible Rallies, and work at Warren County's Tuberculosis Sanitarium and a local nursing home. By 1956 there were only three classes being offered. In 1957 the ministry was discontinued, and Robinson moved to Tuscaloosa, Alabama, to assume similar responsibilities.

THE COLLECTION

This small collection contains the organizational papers, correspondence, minutes of monthly business meetings, financial records, essays produced by children, and monthly attendance reports for the Child Evangelism Fellowship of Warren County.
