Minutes of Board Meeting

Jan. 21, 1921.

The Board of Regents met in the office of President H. H. Cherry, there being present State Superintendent of Education, Mr. Geo. Colvin, Judge J. P. Haswell, and Mr. J. Whit Potter, Regents, with President Cherry.

The sale of Frisbie and Bailey Halls was confirmed by the Board and the deed was ordered to be drawn and State Superintendent Colvin was authorized to execute it on behalf of the Board.

The Board discussed the finances of the institution and authorized Regent Potter to dispose of \$30,000 worth of State Warrants at the best price obtainable, \$30,000 worth of business University notes and \$20,000 worth of bonds for notes on the same, and to see that the indebtedness was cared for.
