***ORGANIZATIONAL HISTORY***

The Greenpan Brothers & Company store operated at 431-433 Park Row and later at 916 State Street in Bowling Green, Kentucky. The firm was established by L. Greenspan, an Austrian immigrant. The firm's operation was then transferred to Adolph Greenspan, and finally it was run for an extended period of time by brothers Reuben and Segó Greenspan. The store operated until 1936, one year after Reuben's death. Segó later became a salesman for another dry goods store and eventually opened a shoe store at 325 E. Main in Bowling Green. Reuben was buried in Nashville's Jewish Cemetery. Segó also died in Bowling Green in 1966 and was also buried in Nashville's Jewish Cemetery.

***COLLECTION NOTES***

This collection consists of six record books, 1910-1936, for a major dry goods store in Bowling Green, Kentucky. The collection also includes a 1931 inventory and sundry receipts, 1930-1934, found in the volumes.
