***BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE***

Donald G. Porter was born December 17, 1928 in Centertown, Kentucky. Janice A. (Insko) Porter was born January 7, 1932 in Buechel Kentucky. They both attended Western Kentucky State College (now Western Kentucky University), and both worked in the campus cafeteria where they met in 1950. In 1952, after Don graduated he was drafted into the Army. After his basic training he was sent to Europe for the remainder of his service. Don served as Troop Information and Education Director for his company, a medical Ambulance division in Germany. At home, Janice continued her studies and, like many others at the time, dealt with the complications of a boyfriend overseas in the Army. Don served in the Army for 18 months and returned to Kentucky after the War. He came back to Western and earned his Master's degree in History in 1955. Janice, after sitting out for the 1953-54 school year, finished her Bachelor's degree in Home Economics, also in 1955.

***COLLECTION NOTE***

This collection consists of correspondence between Donald Porter and his girlfriend, later his wife, Janice Insko. The early letters are from Don to Janice over the summer of 1951, just before his graduation. By September 1951 he was in the Army. Don's letters describe the life of a support soldier during the years of the Korean War. Janice's letters, by contrast, discuss student life at Western to keep Don informed. Janice mentions many campus events, including musical performances by "The Hilltoppers", observations about faculty, and student pranks. After Don's discharge in August 1953, a gap exists in his letters that is not resumed until the summer of 1955 when he started work on his Master's degree. By this time Janice had graduated and had begun teaching, so the couple resumes their correspondence.

When processed the correspondence was combined and organized chronologically. Also included in the collection are postcards, photographs and memorabilia relating to Western.
