For the past 50 years, urban development such as suburbs, shopping malls,

For the past 50 years, urban developments such as suburbs, shopping malls, highways, and retail chains have impacted the way that Americans live their everyday lives. All of these establishments have made life easier in a sense, yet more face paced. While it is nice to quickly accomplish that daunting to-do list, these developments have demolished the main streets and downtowns of America. No longer do residents enjoy scenic shopping days, coffee in the park or simply a stroll around the town. Thus resulting in downtown business establishments closing and buildings became condemned. The property around what used to be an area full of life, fun and excitement became dull, boring and underappreciated. Throughout America, many towns have adopted the *Main* Street approach: "to look again at Main Street, the heart of the community, to save its historic buildings, to revive its commercial core, to strengthen business, to control community-eroding sprawl, and keep a sense of place and community life in America."

As I began the capstone experience, I quickly decided that I wanted to somehow include the *Main Street* approach in my research as well as diving a bit deeper into the past of Bowling Green. I was interested in the community and its history since I have spent the past four years living in this town and didn't know much about it. I also wanted to incorporate into my project the skills and knowledge of Interior Design that I have acquired throughout my college career. To encompass all of these aspects, I decided to focus on buildings in Bowling Green that are in desperate need of preservation and renovation.

For my capstone experience project I have proposed a design for Galloway Place at 601 State Street in Circus Square Park, Bowling Green, Kentucky. This building, built in the year 1949, is currently a temporary office for the Downtown Redevelopment Association. The building once belonged to Frank and Henry Galloway of Galloway Motor Co., then home to Quick Lincoln-Mercury and was then bought by the City of Bowling Green in 2003. Considering that the property is the cornerstone of Circus Square Park, I wanted to redesign this structure to include businesses that would make an impact on the downtown Bowling Green community. I chose to design a salon, spa and a restaurant in the existing structure and a boutique hotel on the neighboring lot. I chose these

facilities with the intent of drawing the crowds and visitors from the new Hot Rods baseball field, Western Kentucky University, Corvette lovers and of course Bowling Green residents, whom want to take a stroll through the park, dine or relax. The goal was to provide a lush environment for guests while still preserving the design style of this moderne streamlined building from the late 1940's.

Throughout the past eight months, I have researched the downtown

Bowling Green community to discover the impact that preservation of historic

buildings can have on the residents and business owners of this town. This

research has included interviews with local residents, trips to boutique hotels and

visits to the Kentucky museum in order to delve a bit deeper into Bowling Green's

rich heritage.

In order to get ideas on the current issues and concerns around the Bowling Green area, I attended a local Landmark Association meeting. Their mission is to "advocate the preservation, protection and maintenance of architectural, cultural and archaeological resources in Bowling Green and Warren County, Kentucky." I found it interesting how many buildings in the Bowling Green area were "endangered" of being demolished. Most of the

committee members concerns were how to give the community a voice and how to support the preservation of these buildings. Between 1980 and 1991, the Landmark Association was involved in the *Main Street* project in which they rehabilitated and proposed new construction of more than 50 commercial properties. According to preservationnation.org "the four points of the *Main Street* approach work together to build a sustainable and complete community revitalization effort". These four points include:

- Organization "involves getting everyone working toward the same goal and assembling the appropriate human and financial resources to implement a *Main Street* revitalization program."
- Promotion "sells a positive image of the commercial district and encourages consumers and investors to live, work, shop, play and invest in the *Main Street* district.
- Design "means getting Main Street into top physical shape.
 Capitalizing on its best assets such as historic buildings and pedestrian-oriented streets..."
- Economic Restructuring "strengthens a community's existing economic assets while expanding and diversifying its economic base."

These 4 points were the main goals in my design. Throughout my research I realized how many towns in America are losing their local history by demolishing old buildings. By taking the *Main Street* approach to my project, I was able to focus on the community as a whole. I wanted to design the structure to become a resort for tourists of Bowling Green as well as the local community.

The process of re-designing this existing structure and constructing the design for an entire new building was a bit more difficult than I had originally expected. I wanted to preserve the existing structure as much as possible; from the exposed original yellow brick throughout the building, the original domed ceiling and skylights, as well as the beautiful rows of windows located in what was the showroom for the Galloway Motor Company. For the new structure, I decided to mimic the original building by including sets of these windows that provide a fantastic view.

As I began to come up with a concept for the entire resort, I researched the time period between the 1940's and 1950's. I decided to go with the design style of Mid-Century Modern. I was greatly inspired by Frank Lloyd Wright, a great American architect, and his organic and

modern approach to architecture and furniture. Mid-Century Modern design is defined by open floor plans, ample amounts of windows, and "form follows function" meaning that every bit of the space is utilized and is fully functional for the typical user.

Throughout this phase of the project I had a lot of trouble narrowing down how I wanted each of the facilities to look. I chose many different possibilities and truly struggled with finding a concept for each space that I thought would complement the structure and its original finishes as well as convey to anyone entering the space the time period that I was modeling my design after. I also wanted all of the facilities to complement each other. I feel that I may have spent too much time on this phase of the project, since most of the original ideas I had didn't make it to the final design. I decided to model the restaurant after a classic fifties diner, including lots of chrome, vinyl and cherry red materials. For the salon and spa I was inspired by a set of old-fashioned pink "beehive" hairdryers that lead to an "atomic age" theme. I included soft pinks and greens to give the space a fun and funky atmosphere. For the hotel design, I wanted to give the guests a comfortable relaxed space with classic furniture from the

time period. From these concepts I came up with the names for each facility; at the Galloway Resort guests will stay at the Starlite Hotel, dine at the Vette City Lounge and relax and rejuvenate at Atomic Betty's Salon and Spa.

Throughout the design of my resort I faced some difficult challenges with the functionality of the floor plan itself, which is what took me the longest to complete. Staying true to the "form follows function" rule was challenging in itself. I wanted the buildings to connect in order to fully utilize the space and allow the guests of the hotel to be able to enjoy the salon, spa and restaurant freely. I also struggled with the how much space to allot each facility. I decided to place the bar for the restaurant in the front showroom of the original structure, with the main dining room and the entire salon and spa in the open warehouse. By doing this, I had to figure out how to allow for the open floor plan and open ceiling and yet still provide privacy for the restrooms and treatment rooms in the spa, as well as take into consideration the sound from each facility.

The hotel floor plan was the most challenging for me. I was unaware when beginning this project the "behind the scenes" functions of

a hotel. In order to determine what was needed in a typical hotel, I visited a modern boutique hotel called "Aloft" in Cool Springs, Tennessee. From this experience, I determined the most important and required spaces in order to provide a fully functional hotel. The hotel bedroom and suite layouts are pretty standard but provide ample storage and closet space, spacious bathrooms and classic mid-century modern designed bedroom sets.

Finishing the floor plan for the building was my biggest obstacle, but once complete it felt as if everything fell into place. I was able to easily pick out furniture that fits well into each space once I had the concept and basic design complete. I simultaneously picked out the building finishes such as carpet, tile, paint, wallcoverings, etc. Once this phase was done, I moved onto perspective drawings and renderings of these models. From here I moved on to complete all of the technical drawings such as the lighting plan, electrical plan and demolition plan.

Accomplishing and completing such a big project was a bit overwhelming. There were many things I would have done differently. For example, I wouldn't have spent so much time coming up with a concept

(this phase in the designing process is very important but it can also be very vast and time consuming) and I would have liked to completed my floor plan a bit earlier so that I would have had more time to add more details to the overall project.

This thesis process has definitely been a huge learning experience for me. It was fun to see such a large project from beginning to end while focusing on the preservation and restoration aspect of design. Taking the *Main Street* approach to my project has also guided me into having a bigger interest for preservation in all historic buildings. I have realized how much impact these older buildings have on the community and society as a whole.




EXISTING ELEVATIONS










SEVENTH STREET SECTION

In order to determine which direction I needed to go in this project, I first needed to understand the concept of a boutique hotel and how it would mesh with downtown bowling green. A boutique hotel is defined as a "luxurious and/or quirky hotel environment." With this in mind, I decided to stick with ena in which the galloway building was erected - a 1950's/Mid-century Modern design. This style emphasizes large and ample amounts of windows, open floor plans and bringing the outdoors in. In order to get a better concept of this design style, I visited frank Lloyd Wright's falling Water and Kentuck Knob in Pennsylvania. Frank Lloyd Wright was a very innovative American architect who promoted open floor plans and organic design. Visiting both of these buildings was a breath taking experience and was really inspiring in the design of my hotel, including the furnishings and finishes. I also visited a modern hotel in franklin, Tennessee in order to see how a modern hotel functions to fit its client's needs. From this experience I recognized all of the essentials for running a hotel smoothly. I also learned a typical setup of a hotel, what it should include and the cool extras that can be thrown in to add additional perks for potential clients.

GOING WITH THE MID-CENTURY MODERN/1950'S THEME, I DECIDED TO INCORPORATE MANY OF THE ELEMENTS THAT DEFINE THIS STYLE - LOTS OF CHROME, BLOCKY FURNITURE, ORGANIC SHAPES, AND OPEN FLOOR PLANS. I CHOOSE TO DESIGN THE RESTAURANT, SALON AND SPA, AND HOTEL AS ONE BIG RESORT MEANING THAT THEY ARE ALL SEPARATE BUSINESSES BUT WORK TOGETHER UNDER ONE ROOF. THE RESTAURANT AND SPA WILL BE IN THE EXISTING BUILDING AND THE HOTEL IS AN ORIGINAL DESIGN BUILT FROM THE GROUND UP, INCORPORATING THE WINDOWS FROM THE ORIGINAL STRUCTURE. OVERALL, I WOULD LIKE TO DESIGN A RESORT FOR BOWLING GREEN'S HISTORIC DISTRICT THAT WILL PROVIDE THE COMMUNITY WITH A PLACE TO HOST EVENTS, HOUSE OUT OF TOWN VISITORS, AND A PLACE TO RELAX AND ENJOY A NIGHT OUT ON THE TOWN. QUESTS AT THE GALLOWAY RESORT WILL BE ABLE TO REST DEACEFULLY, ENJOY A NICE RELAXING DAY AT THE SPA AND SALON AND A FUN NIGHT AT THE DINER!




















































5 Proposed Hotel Floor Plan Scale: 1/32" = 1'-0"


