- Call to Order** The regular meeting of the Student Government Association was called to order by Vice President Leigh Ann Sears at 5:20 p.m.

- Officer Reports** Keith Coffman, President President Coffman thanked everyone that attended the cookout at the President's House. Chad Lewis, Treasurer Weekly expenditures totaled \$120.00 with outstanding payments totaling \$105.91. By "flexing his SGA muscle" at Mark Struss, there may be a different course of action taken regarding the lighting there. Mr. Struss was concerned that nothing had become of that as of yet. Bill 97-1-F will be coming up for first reading in New Business, he encouraged everyone to support this.

LRC Vice Chairperson Anne Guillory spoke in the absence of Chairperson Andy Gailor. Two pieces of legislation were reviewed during LRC. Bill 97-1-F and Resolution 97-7-F both passed unanimously.

Constitutional Review Chairperson Anne Guillory announced that more attendance was needed at the meetings. After the meeting, please stay if anyone is interested.

Public Relations Vice Chairperson Christoph Miller spoke in the absence of Jenny Stith from last week's meeting. He announced that the committee made a banner for Dr. Ransdell for Midnight Madness. 
