BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

James D. Monroe was born to Melissa and William Monroe on 16 October 1980. He graduated from Greenwood High School in Warren County, Kentucky in 1988 and was employed by the Medical Center in Bowling Green, Kentucky at the time of his military service. He joined the U.S. Marine Corps in 1998 and did his basic training at Parris Island, South Carolina. During Operation Iraqi Freedom he served as a Corporal with Alpha Company, 8th Tank Battalion, 4th Marine Division stationed at Camp Shoupe, Kuwait during Operation Iraqi Freedom. During the course of the correspondence, his wife, Helen (Stiles) Monroe, was in Bowling Green, Kentucky. His service period was from 10 January 2003 to 4 July 2003.

COLLECTION NOTE

The collection includes correspondence between James D. Monroe and his wife Helen, his parents, William W. & Melissa Monroe, relatives and friends, during Operation Iraqi Freedom. Pictures of Camp Shoupe, and of James Monroe on the USS Ashland in the Persian Gulf and Suez Canal, and of Idiawani, Iraq, and An-Nassiriya, Iraq are included.
