#### **BIOGRAPHY**

John Wesley Tyler Givens was born in Glenville, McLean County, Kentucky 22 January 1870. His parents were Joseph Simpson Givens and Phoebe Ann (Tyler) Givens. He attended school in Glenville before continuing his education at Bethel College, Russellville, Kentucky, where he graduated in 1893. While attending the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, he married Myzella May Robertson in 1895. He was licensed to preach by his home church, Glenville Baptist, in 1887 and for over fifty years served churches in Oklahoma, South Carolina, Missouri and Kentucky. In Kentucky he was pastor of churches in Bowling Green, Morgantown, Hopkinsville, Princeton and Marion. He was also a prolific poet; his works are collected in *Heart Throbs and Woodland Melodies* and *Heart Bursts and Heather Blossoms*. He had two children, Edwin who died in 1928 and Mable Grace (Givens) Hudson who died in 1991. Givens died in Bowling Green, Kentucky 1 April 1967 at age 97.

#### COLLECTION

This collection consists primarily of material related to the long career of Baptist minister Givens and includes sermon notes, letters, hymns, news clippings, and biographical and genealogical information. Also, letters relating to his courtship and marriage. Includes his narrative poem *Albert Stone and Mabel Grace: A Legend of Love* and two collections of his poetry *Heart Throbs and Woodland Melodies* and *Heart Bursts and Heather Blossoms*.
