Special Orders

Judicial Council – Chris Whitfield

We passed two rulings. The first ruling of the Judicial Council ruled that in order for an election to begin, a Quorum of the Judicial Council must be in existence two weeks prior to the election. The Quorum must exist to oversee the election, to enforce the Election Codes and bylaws, and to uphold the Constitution. The Fall 2005 election is exempt from this ruling. The second ruling of the Judicial Council granted a blanket exemption to all Fall 2005 Senatorial Candidates from attending the mandatory Candidates Orientation, allowing them to remain eligible candidates.

Melissa Paris appointed Josh Collins and Kara Ratliff to the Organizational Aid Committee. There was no discussion or debate. *Ratliff and Collins were approved with a unanimous vote.*

Unfinished Business

SGA Budget 2005-2006

Melissa Paris was recognized as the author, explaining that the budget is self-explanatory for the most part, but there were cuts to make up for the new programs such as Provide-

A-Ride and Professor Evaluations. During questions, Pik Panida asked why the money for the Buy A Book Program wasn't listed on the budget. Paris said that the funds were added into the miscellaneous programs because it must be voted on each year. Josh Collins asked why \$3000 was allotted for Faculty Evaluations. Paris said that \$3000 was a safe number in case SGA ended up needing to pay for it second semester. There was no debate. *There was a motion to move to previous question and it was seconded. Previous question was voted on and passed. The SGA budget for the 2005 – 2006 year passed unanimously.*
