COLLECTION NOTE

This collection consists of interviews with Artie Emmett Lemaire, Bowling Green, Kentucky, conducted by Janet Tracy. Interviews focus on Lemaire's business of selling merchandise at flea markets and roadside stands. Interview also contains a full biography of Lemaire's life, from growing up in rural central Indiana, being a prisoner of war in World War II, and working with the Salvation Army for twenty years prior to his retirement, after which he took up itinerant selling.
