**BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE**

Thomas Phillips (1774-1843) was born near Glasgow, Scotland, and came to Philadelphia about 1797. The next year he moved to Paris, Kentucky, and in 1803 he married a Paris widow, Susannah (Edwards) Reeder, a daughter of John Edwards, one of Kentucky's first Senators. In 1806 they moved to Todd County, settling about two miles from Elkton, and resided there the rest of their lives. Benjamin E. and Mary Jane were two of their eight children. Benjamin E. lived in Clinton, Mississippi, and Nacogdoches, Texas. He married Atala Augusta Hotchkiss of Nacogdoches in 1839, and they had a daughter named Catherine (b. 1843?). Mary Jane (1814-1860) resided in Elkton all of her life. She married David Clark Reeves (1809-1841) in 1834, and they had one daughter, Ellen. Several years after the death of her first husband, Mary Jane wed Dr. James Alexander McReynolds (1812-1869). In 1859, Ellen (1840-1916) married Dr. John Oliver McReynolds (1827-1905), and they had the following children: Mary Bell Zarecor (1860-1934), James Clark (1862-1946), Robert Phillips (1871-1952), and Ellen R. (1880-1888).

Thomas Phillips' great-grandson James Clark McReynolds received a B.S. degree from Vanderbilt University in 1882 and graduated from the University of Virginia Law Department in 1884. He practiced law for a number of years in Nashville, Tennessee; was U.S. assistant Attorney General from 1903 to 1907; practiced law in New York City; served in 1913 and 1914 as U.S. attorney-general in President Wilson's cabinet; and served as associate justice of the U.S. Supreme Court from 1914 to 1941. Although he made Washington, D.C. his home, Justice McReynolds retained close ties with his Kentucky family.

## **COLLECTION NOTE**

Letters compose the major portion of this collection, and they are chiefly the correspondence of Susannah (Mrs. Thomas) Phillips, 1837-1843 (10 items); Thomas Phillips, 1838-1840 (3), and Mary Jane (Phillips) Reeves McReynolds, 1838-1857 (16). In addition, there are letters to Ellen Reeves, 1856?-1858 (5); receipts of G.E. Phillips, 1837-1839 (6); letters to John Oliver McReynolds; and miscellaneous papers, 1829-1860 (10). The correspondence, 1945 (17), between Mary T. Moore, librarian of the Kentucky Library, and Justice McReynolds, co-donor of the collection, is included. Also, there are four manuscript booklets: recipes for food and medicines, recipes for making dyes, an autograph album of Mary Jane Reeves, 1836-1846, and one entitled, "scraps of history and the sayings of great men selected by Mary Jane Phillips in the 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> years of her age." Biographical and genealogical materials (holographic, typescript, and photocopy) are included.

Also of interest is a photocopy of questions answered by Kentucky Senator John Edwards before the Democratic Society of Washington, D.C., about the free navigation of the Mississippi River in 1794. The original is in The Library of Congress.
