#### **BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE**

Sammie D. Akers was born in Logan County on 27 January 1918 to John B. and Betty A. (Whitney) Akers. He had one sister, Nell, who married Floyd Branum and lived for many years in Nashville, Tennessee. Mr. Akers went to public schools in Logan County and later served in the U.S. Army during World War II. After his military service he worked as a Kentucky probation officer. He was a member of the New Union Baptist Church and a Mason for over fifty years. He did not marry. Akers died on 17 October 2002 and was interred at Russellville's Maple Grove Cemetery near his parents.

#### **COLLECTION NOTE**

This collection consists almost exclusively of Sammie D. Akers's World War II correspondence with his family and friends. Approximately two-thirds of the correspondence is with his mother, Betty W. Akers. This collection is the rare one that includes correspondence (both letters to and from) of a soldier. After 1944, a great deal of Sammie's letters home are Vmails. The letters to his parents are generally addressed to his mother, with whom he discusses the home farm, potential land purchases, local news, and church events. Correspondence with his friends deals with the same topics, although he will sometimes mention matters related to courtship. Very few letters from Sammie to any other correspondent, outside his parents, are found here.

The letters were removed from envelopes, dated, and collated with vinyl-coated paper clips. The correspondence of Akers and his parents was arranged chronologically. Individual folders of correspondence with other family or friends were created if there were at least five letters from that individual; the rest were placed together in folders at the end of the collection. The collection also contains a folder of letters sent to John B. and Betty W. Akers and a folder related to the settlement of the Virgil I. Whitney estate.
