

The game tonight marks the first time Western has met Howard since 1942. FOR OFFICIALS' SIGNALS AND PENALTIES, SEE PAGE 12



Western Plays Howard For First Time Since 1941

Howard College, an invader from Birmingham, Ala., has been a frequent opponent on Western's football schedule since 1934. The two elevens have met five times previously with the Hilltoppers taking only one game, the Bulldogs three and one resulted in a 0-0 deadlock.

In 1941 when Howard last appeared as a Western gridiron opponent, the Bulldogs scored a 20-7 triumph in the Western stadium before a Dad's Day crowd of 3,000 fans. The Hilltoppers were unable to stop Jimmy Tarrant, one of the sparkiest sparkplugs ever to play on Western soil. He repeatedly circled the Western ends for nice gains, played brilliantly in the safety position, did a neat job of kicking and hit with 14 of his 24 bullet-like passes. The two schools have not met on the gridiron since then until tonight's game.

The first meeting came on Homecoming day, 1934. It was in this game that the 0-0 tie resulted. The following year found the Birmingham eleven back in the Western stadium for the Hilltoppers' Homecoming game. This time Western absorbed the worst licking in the history of Homecoming tilts by a 19-0 count.

In 1936 the Bulldogs eked out a 14-6 victory in a hard-fought ball game which was not decided until the final gun sounded. The following year found the two schools not playing each other but in 1938 they took up the gridiron battle again. This time the Hilltoppers came through with a 6-0 win, their only triumph to date registered over the southerners. The Bulldogs came in with a highly touted triple-threat man in Clyde White but the Hilltoppers never let him get loose. Western's lone score came after Raymond VanMeter recovered a fumble by White. With Duke Dulaney tossing to Curly Pitman and George Bibich barreling through the line for long gains, Western went from the Howard 45-yard stripe to the three from where Bibich carried it over. Thus the Hilltoppers cracked into the winning column for the first time against the Bulldogs.

Howard and Western did not meet again until 1941 when the Bulldogs brought in another triple-threat man in Tarrant and he lived up to his advance notices with devastating results.

To date Howard has outscored Western 53 points to 19. Tonight's game will be the first time the current crop of Hilltopper gridders have had a crack at the Bulldogs. They will be trying to make the resumption of the meeting with Howard an auspicious one for Western with the difference in the points scored cut down and the string of Bulldog victories thoroughly snapped.

Howard was a football power among the smaller schools throughout the South before the war. This year marks the first season they have actively entered the football arena since the war and with the great victorious tradition built up during the thirties to urge them on the Bulldogs promise to be a potent threat to any team.

Western also carries a great victory heritage handed down by mighty Hilltopper teams since 1913. Both schools are seeking to re-establish the glory known before the war interrupted and called away some of their greatest stars. This year's meeting will bring together two ambitious teams surging for the heights once known to both.
