4.1 - Academics Committee - Mrs. Patsy Judd, Chairman; Mr. Joseph A. Cook; Dr. Eugene E. Evans; Mrs. Hughlyne P. Wilson; Judge John S. Palmore - Mrs. Judd reported that the committee met prior to the Board meeting to consider the following two recommendations:

RECOMMENDATION:

President Kern Alexander recommends adoption of the following items submitted by the Vice President for Academic Affairs:

Recommendation 1: Proposed Academic Renewal Policy

Background:

(

This policy was recommended by a Task Force on Nontraditional Education and Students appointed by the Vice President for Academic Affairs. The policy recommended by the Task Force was revised by the Academic Requirements and Regulations Committee, a subcommittee of the Academic Council. The policy is designed to provide qualified undergraduate students who have not attended a college or university for two years with a "second chance" to pursue an academic degree. The policy has been approved by the Academic Council and the Vice President for Academic Affairs. The policy as approved states:

An academic renewal program is available to qualified undergraduate students. Academic renewal prevents the voided course work from counting toward graduation or the computation of the grade point average; however, the voided course work will remain a part of the transcript. Qualified undergraduate students must not have attended any accredited college or university for at least two previous years and must have completed a minimum of 12 semester hours of courses numbered 100 or above with a grade point average of 2.0 or better after readmission.

The student must petition the Registrar in writing to request academic renewal, indicating whether one semester or all previous course work is to be voided. No student may declare academic renewal more than once.

With the approval of the Academics Committee, Mrs. Judd moved adoption of the Academic Renewal Policy as submitted. The motion was seconded by Mrs. Wilson and passed by voice vote.

Recommendation 2: Proposed Masters of Health Administration (Department of Health and Safety)

Background:

The Masters of Health Administration will prepare the graduates to participate in a national and, to some extent, international job market. However, the program is intended to meet the current needs for health administration training in Kentucky. At the present time, no other M.H.A. degree programs are in operation in the Commonwealth, according to the Council on Higher Education's list of approved programs.

Facilities are currently adequate in meeting the space requirements for the MHA program. No additional faculty will be needed to initiate the program; however, anticipated growth of the program will require the recruitment of one additional faculty member in the third year. No new funds will be required to implement the Masters of Health Administration.

Approved by the Academics Committee, Mrs. Judd moved adoption of the Masters of Health Administration as submitted. The motion was seconded by Mr. Strode and passed by voice vote.

AGENDA ITEM 6 - Presentation of recommendations to the President from the Vice President for Academic Affairs.

Dr. Robert Haynes, Vice President for Academic Affairs, commented on the following informational items that were approved by the Academic Council, endorsed by the Vice President for Academic Affairs, and submitted to the Board for informational purposes:

Information Item 1:

Revision in the Curriculum Requirements of the Baccalaureate in Nursing--Department of Nursing

This revision in the curriculum will allow students a choice between technical nursing (associate degree) and professional nursing (baccalaureate degree); will better meet the needs of transfer students and registered nurses; and will provide the essential knowledge and skills needed for the future.

<u>Information Item 2</u>:

Revision of the Graduate and Undergraduate Speech and Communication Disorders Program—Department of Teacher Education

Significant changes in standards and requirements for academic preparation at both the state and national levels for state licensure and American Speech and Hearing Association (ASHA) certification mandates a revision of the two undergraduate and the graduate degree programs. The revisions will meet the new standards and requirements and will enhance the competitiveness of WKU students for employment opportunities and for admission to advanced study in the field.

Information Item 3:

Revision of the Wording of the Class Attendance Policy-Academic Requirements and Regulations Committee of the Academic Council

The revision in the Class Attendance Policy will better clarify the intended purpose of the policy for both the faculty member and the student.

Information Item 4:

Revision in the Curriculum of the Bachelor of Arts in Philosophy and Religion--Department of Philosophy and Religion

The revisions in the curriculum of the major in Philosophy and Religion are being made at the recommendation of the American Philosophical Association. This revision in the curriculum puts the Department of Philosophy and Religion in the

mainstream, among the majority, of the philosophy departments across the country.

Information Item 5:

Revision in the Program Requirements of the Master of Arts in Education--Department of Art

The revision in the program requirements are being made to strengthen the University's program in the visual arts, to improve preparation for the teaching of art in elementary and secondary schools, to conform to revised requirements for the Kentucky Standard High School Certificate, and to meet new standards for program accreditation by the National Association of Schools of Art and Design.

Information Item 6:

Curriculum Revision in the Bachelor of Science in Computer Science-Department of Computer Science

This curriculum revision is being made to strengthen the computer science major and to bring the program more in line with the standard set by the Computing Sciences Accreditation Board.

Information Item 7:

Curriculum Revision in the Bachelor of Music in Performance (Instrumental Option and Vocal Option)--Department of Music

These curriculum changes were made to bring the programs into compliance with the accreditation standards of the National Association of Schools of Music.

Information Item 8:

(

Proposed Cooperative Ph.D. Program between Southern Illinois University at Carbondale and Western Kentucky University

The proposed Cooperative Ph.D. Program between Southern Illinois University at Carbondale and Western Kentucky University would be beneficial to both institutions. The combined strengths and resources in terms of faculty, institutional programs, teaching, and research will result in a qualitatively superior course of study. The cooperative program will enhance the opportunities for more Kentucky students to pursue doctoral studies at SIU-C. Assessibility to the doctoral program will enhance WKU's competitiveness in recruiting first level graduate students. These students will contribute to the supply of quality doctoral students at SIU-C. The joint program would encourage faculty members from similar departments to interact professionally. Also, WKU faculty will benefit from the opportunity of working with doctoral students in instructional research activities.

The program will require no additional facilities, faculty, or funding.

Dr. Haynes noted that the Cooperative Ph.D Program would allow Western Kentucky University graduate students in a particular field to be admitted to a doctoral program in Carbondale while they are finishing their master's program at Western. Other students may enter the graduate program at Carbondale with having already obtained a master's and continue to take various course work on the Western campus. The advantage for Western is because it extends our graduate education considerably;

the advantage for Southern Illinois is that it will undoubtly attract an increase in the number of students in their doctoral programs. The agreement is between institutions, and the departments at Western will now be encouraged to work with their counterparts at Southern Illinois to design specific joint doctoral programs.

(

Dr. Haynes commended Dr. Gray for his work in negotiating the agreement with Southern Illinois for the Cooperative Ph.D Program.

President Alexander stated, "We consider the Cooperative Doctoral Program with Southern Illinois to be a very important initiative for us here at Western. It allows our faculty to serve on the doctoral committees—Ph.D Committees—at graduate research universities. They have a higher level of faculty, which is known as doctoral research faculty. This would allow our faculty to be approved, based on their qualifications, to doctoral research faculty at Southern Illinois

University; and it certainly is a stimulus for our faculty to work with their faculty and to enhance our own skills and knowledge as well as the students who could come to Western, design a doctoral program at Western, pursue studies here at Western, and then move on into the final stages at Southern Illinois. We hope to have more of these later with possibly Alabama, Vanderbilt, and other institutions."

AGENDA ITEM 7 - Report by the President.

Dr. Alexander reported that the Annual Superintendent's Gathering on the Western Campus will be June 17. The day will be highlighted with the naming of the College of Education Building the "Tate C. Page Hall."

Mrs. Wilson moved that the Board of Regents go into closed session for discussions which might lead to the appointment, discipline, or dismissal of an individual. The reason for closed session discussion is to protect the reputation of individual persons being considered. The motion was seconded by Mr. Butler, and passed by voice vote. The Board went into closed session at 2:10 p.m., and Mrs. Esters, Secretary to the Board, accompanied the Board in the closed session.

The Board returned from closed session at approximately 2:50 p.m. Chairman Iracane reported that during the closed session the Board discussed only matters within the scope of the motion and took no formal action and made no decisions.

Mr. Iracane reported that the Board would meet again in a special session on the morning of June 8, 1988, at 8 a.m.

Mr. Todd introduced the new student body president and the incoming student regent, Mr. Scott Whitehouse. Scott is a senior marketing major from Louisville.

There being no further business, motion for adjournment was made by Mr. Butler and seconded by Mrs. Wilson. The meeting adjourned at 2:52 p.m.
