ORGANIZATIONAL HISTORY

Appalshop is a media, arts, and education center located in Whitesburg, Kentucky. Founded in 1969 under the leadership of Bill Richardson, Appalshop began as a project of the United States government's War on Poverty. In 1974, the worker-operated organization evolved into a nonprofit company and established itself as the primary hub of filmmaking in and about Appalachia. Since that time, it has produced more than one hundred films covering such topics as coal mining, environmental issues, traditional culture, and economics.

COLLECTION NOTE

This collection primarily contains short films produced by Appalshop, whose chief goal in the Access to Artistic Excellence Project was to preserve and present film and audio of master traditional artists and to build strong appreciation for Appalachian culture, art, and traditions. As a primary regional repository, Appalshop is important not only to Kentucky, but indeed to the entire Appalachian region. Appalshop has documented some of the region's most important folk artists, including: Hazel Dickens, Lily May Ledford, Morgan Sexton, Jean Ritchie, and others.

The Access to Artistic Excellence Project is a program funded by a grant from the National Endowment for the Arts. Included in the collection are letters of support from Bob Gates to the NEA for the project.
