***BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE***

Nana Yaa Asantewaa, a native Kentuckian, is an internationally known storyteller, artist, and workshop facilitator. She is the founder and president of the Arts Council of Louisville. She is best known for her stories concerning African American heritage and has traveled to share stories in the Virgin Islands, Ghana, Togo, Ivory Coast, Senegal, Gambia, and Gabon. She received the distinguished Governor's Community Artist Award and represented Louisville as a delegate to the 1994 International African and African American Summit.

***COLLECTION NOTE***

This collection features an audio application on cassette tape for an apprenticeship grant from the Kentucky Arts Council through the "Folk Arts Apprenticeship" program. Master artist Nana Yaa Asantewaa and apprentice Marilyn Harrod applied to the Kentucky Arts Council, which receives funding for apprenticeships through the National Endowment for the Arts.
