HILLTOPPERS CLOSE SEASON TODAY IN TWENTY-FOURTH MEETING WITH MURRAY; WESTERN OUT TO SNAP THREE - GAME THOROUGHbred WINNING STREAK

Western's Hilltoppers and the Murray Thoroughbreds meet on the gridiron for the twenty-fourth time today. This historic football series began back in 1931 with Western taking a 7-0 decision. Western will be seeking to break a Murray three-game winning streak today.

Since that initial clash the two rivals have collided every year with the exception of 1943, '44 and '45 when the Hilltoppers did not field a team because of World War II. The Hilltoppers hold a one game edge in the series, having won 10 of the fiercely contested battles, lost nine and fought to four deadlocks.

The Thoroughbreds hold a definite edge in the scoring, having notched 252 points to the Hilltoppers' 244. This budge in the scoring column was piled up in two Murray three-game winning streaks when the Thoroughbreds thoroughly swamped the Hilltoppers. From 1946 through 1948 the Thoroughbreds won by scores of 55-6, 20-0 and 34-7 before the Hilltoppers broke the drought with a 10-7 win in 1949.

Murray took off on another three-game spree in 1954 which the Hilltoppers will be trying to break today. It was 19-0 in '54, 28-12 in '55 and 34-13 in '56.

Murray scored its first win in the series in 1933 by a 20-6 count. It was 27-14 for Murray in 1934. Western dominated from that date until the termination of hostilities because of the war in 1943. Murray could only manage ties in 1937, 1939 and 1941.

Since the resumption of activities in 1946 following the wartime cessation, Murray has held the upper hand. The Thoroughbreds have won seven of the meetings, Western has taken three and one game resulted in a 27-27 tie.

So today Coach Nick Denes will be sending his team out for the last time this season against an ancient and respected foe to conclude his first year in the college coaching ranks.

PENALTIES

1. Taking more than five times out during either half (except for replacement of injured player).
2. Illegal delay of game.
3. Failure to complete substitution before play starts.

16. Violation of rules during intermission.
17. Illegal return of suspended player.

29. Striking an opponent with fist, forearm, elbow or locked hands, kicking or kneeling — Mandatory disqualification of offending player plus loss of fifteen yards.

30. Foul within the one yard line—half the distance to the goal.

LOSS OF FIVE YARDS

6. Putting ball in play before Referee signals "Ready-for-play".
7. Failure to maintain proper alignment of offensive team when ball is snapped. Also, backfield man illegally in motion.
8. Offside by either team or encroachment on neutral zone.
9. Attempt to draw opponents offside.

LOSS OF FIFTEEN YARDS

19. Interference with opportunity of player of receiving team to catch a kick.
20. Illegal use of hands or arms by offensive player.
21. Tackling or blocking defensive player who has made fair catch.
22. Roughing the kicker.
23. Piling up, hurdling, clipping.

OTHER PENALTIES

31. Interference by defensive team on forward pass—passing team's ball at spot of foul.

32. Forward pass being touched by ineligible receiver beyond the line of scrimmage—loss of fifteen yards from spot of preceding down and loss of a down.

11. Illegal forward pass (includes intentional grounding of forward pass). Also loss of down.

12. Taking more than two steps after Fair Catch is made.

13. Player on line receiving snap.

25. Coaching from sidelines.

26. Failure to stop one full second following shift.

27. Defensive holding.

28. Invalid Signal for Fair Catch.

33. Illegal touching of kicked ball within opponent's ten yard line — touchback.

34. Flagrantly rough play or unsportsmanlike conduct — Mandatory disqualification plus loss of fifteen yards.
