#### WESTERN KENTUCKY STATE COLLEGE

Serving the citizens of the Commonwealth from South-Central Kentucky in Bowling Green is Western Kentucky State College, where progress is the keynote....and constant growth and expansion an actuality.

Although a relatively young institution dating from the time of its founding in 1906, Western Kentucky has taken giant strides in its short 55 year history. Originally created for the sole purpose of teacher training, Western Kentucky now offers three undergraduate degrees and the master's degree with course offerings in twenty-four different departments.

The Bachelor of Arts, the Bachelor of Science, the Bachelor of Music and the Master of Arts degrees are offered. In addition, pre-professional work leading to entrance in professional and technical colleges for advanced study is also offered.

Now with an enrollment of more than 3, 800 students, Western Kentucky as a co-educational institution is in the midst of the greatest building program in its history. Buildings completed for occupancy this fall include a \$1.5 million Science Building and a \$780,000 dormitory with a combined grill and snack-bar.

Construction has begun on a \$2.5 million academic-athletic building and a six-story women's dormitory, with plans nearly completed for two more dormitories and a new training school on the near horizon.

Presenting an excitingly beautiful view from any entrance to the city, the Western Kentucky campus stands on the crest of a hill overlooking the city of Bowling Green and the Barren River Valley. The campus embraces an area of 120 acres on which thirty college buildings are located.

The Western Stadium, located in a natural setting on the east side of the campus, has a capacity of 5,500. Crowned by a majestic colonnade at the top of the Stadium, the football arena is one of the most striking attractions on the Western Kentucky campus.

In addition to football, a complete schedule of intercollegiate athletics is played in basketball, baseball, track, tennis, and golf at Western Kentucky.

#### HILLT OPPER COACHES



NICK DENES

Heading the Hilltopper football coaching staff in 1961 for the fifth consecutive season is the affable Nick Denes, one of Kentucky's most successful coaches for the past three decades.

Now in his thirty-second year in the coaching profession, Denes entered the college ranks after collecting practically all of the honors offered in the high school coaching of athletics in the state.

The highlights of the successful Denes' career were fashioned at Louisville Male High School where he was named "Coach of the Year" for 1951 after guiding his Male football team to the state championship. Denes also grabbed seven state track crowns while at Male, served as line coach on two more championship football squads, and led his 1936 Corbin, Kentucky, basketball team to the state title.

Born Nicholas George Denes on February 22, 1906, in Garrett, Indiana, where he spent his youth, Denes began his brilliant coaching career after graduating from the University of Illinois in 1929. Prior to coming to Western in 1957 as head football coach, Denes had a one-year stint as an assistant coach of the Hilltoppers under Coach W. L. Terry during the 1939 season.

Now with a great high school record behind him, an overall record in athletics of 456 victories, 143 losses and 10 ties, and just about even in the college football coaching ranks with a 16-18-2 record, Denes figures to give opposing coaching a fair share of trouble for a while yet.

An excellent recruiter in addition to his talents as coach, Denes has accomplished one of the most creditable jobs of recruiting outstanding prospects for Western this year that has been done in many seasons.

Appreciated as a friend by his associates, Denes is a credit to his profession.

FRANK GRIFFIN

Serving as line coach of Hilltopper teams since 1948 has been the popular Frank Griffin. A talented end himself on Western football teams in the years just preceding World War II, Griffin is a native of Ashland, Kentucky. He joined the Western staff in 1946 as trainer, following a five year tour of duty with the U.S. Navy, and was elevated to his present position two years later.

A real task-master who drives his linemen hard, Griffin demands, and gets, hard work from his men. The tough conditioning pays off, though, as the Hilltoppers are the first to admit.

Another major coaching area for Griffin is intercollegiate golf, with his Western teams always serious contenders for the Ohio Valley Conference title year after year.



TURNER ELROD

A Bowling Green native, backfield coach Turner Elrod is one of the outstanding sports alumni of Western Kentucky. From 1927 until 1930 Elrod was a triple threat at Western, lettering in football, basketball, and baseball.

Prior to joining the Western coaching staff in 1949, Elrod coached high school athletics in the

state for many years, formerly serving as athletic director and assistant football coach at Barrett High School, Henderson, Kentucky.

An advocate of strong defensive play, Elrod drills his men well in fundamentals. He is a strict disciplinarian, yet is respected and well liked by the men he coaches.

A veteran of World War II, Elrod is also coach of the Western track team in the spring sports program.



JIM FEIX


A Little All-America quarterback at Western Kentucky during the 1952 season, Jim Feix was named to the post of quarterback coach of his former team in 1958. During the 1957 season while completing requirements for the M. A. degree, Feix served as a student assistant.

While a member of Hilltopper teams himself,

Feix ranked among the top passers in the nation during both his junior and senior years. He gained national recognition for his quarterbacking of Western Kentucky's Refrigerator Bowl champions in 1952.

Feix uses his own past quarterbacking experiences to advantage in coaching the Hilltoppers. A friendly, engaging person, he is one of the most popular members of the Western coaching staff.

A native of Henderson, Feix served as a pilot in the U.S. Air Force from 1953 until 1957 when he returned to Western Kentucky to begin graduate work.





DENNY MCATEE



LEE MURRAY...Junior...6-1...185...Russellville, Ala...A junior college graduate from Itawamba, Mississippi, Murray looked outstanding in spring practice. He is rugged and tough, and has excellent moves. Much is expected of this fellow this year.

BILL MUMFORD...Junior...5-11...180...Troy, Ohio...He's quick and agile, and knows his position. He needs experience, but with a little aging in action he could develop into a good man.

JIM TAYLOR...Senior...6-2...200...Clarksville, Tenn...He has the desire, the size, and the movements. Taylor will see plenty of action and should prove to be a tremendous help at tackle. A junior college graduate, Taylor can play the game, as proved by his All-OVC honorable mention selection last year.


BARRY POOLE... Junior... 6-0... 205... Madisonville, Ky... Poole may now be ready to play rugged football, after being hampered by injuries early in his college career. He has the size and know-how for both offensive and defensive action.

BILL O'FLYNN... Junior... 6-0... 200... Owensboro, Ky... A veteran Hilltopper with plenty of experience at his position, O'Flynn will be a valuable reserve. He should have the opportunity this year to prove what he can do.

STEVE THOM...Junior...6-0...210...New Albany, Ind...After a one-year lay-off while he worked on academic difficulties, Thom is expected to give greatly needed depth to the tackle position. He is an excellent prospect.

PAUL FINNISETH...Junior...6-1...220...Ft. Thomas, Ky...A transfer from the University of Kentucky, Finniseth is a husky, rugged defensive player with a lot of determination. He looked extremely talented at his position in spring drills and should be ready to play a lot of football.

DICK FISCHER...Sophomore...6-1...205...Louisville, Ky...One of the best from last year's freshman group, he saw a lot of action with the varsity. Fischer has proved he wants to play, and that he has the ability to go with that desire.

KEEN JOHNSON...Senior...5-8...185....Mt. Sterling, Ky...A fine guard, Johnson has gained valuable experience the past two seasons as a reserve. He knows his position and should be in the starting line-up for the Hilltoppers.

#### KEEN JOHNSON

JOE BUGEL...Junior...6-1...215...Munhall, Pa...Considered one of the best guard prospects for the 1961 Hilltoppers, Bugel has been outstanding in reserve use. If he lives up to his potential, he'll see a lot of action.

OLLIE NEWELL... Junior... 5-8... 185... Point Pleasant, W. Va... Ollie saw quite a bit of action last year while backing up All-OVC first team selection Herb Wassom. With the latter gone via graduation, Newell should be the man on the spot. Given the chance, he can produce.

JOHN BARRIOLO... Junior... 6-0... 200... Moorhead, Miss... A junior college graduate, Barriolo is a good prospect. He has good moves and experience, and should be able to play the rugged OVC-style football. FRED MILLER...Junior...6-1...200...Louisville, Ky...Miller's fine speed coupled with his size make him a dangerous threat. A transfer student, he should be a valuable addition to the Western squad.

JOE IRACANE... Junior... 5-10... 205... Brooklyn, N.Y... An experienced guard, Iracane returns after a year's absence caused by academic problems. He'll be counted on for important reserve strength.

JIM TURNER...Sophomore...5-10...195...Chatsworth, Ga...He hasn't had much opportunity to prove himself, but may get the chance this year. He'll need experience, but with time he could develop into a fine performer.

JERRY MOTLEY...Senior...6-1...200...Bowling Green, Ky...A home-town product who has been used in reserve roles the past two seasons, Motley may get the chance to prove himself this year. He's got the size for the job.

BOBBY WESTMORELAND...Junior...6-1...225...Celina, Tenn...A husky block-buster who can move well, too, he could be a vital performer in the weakened center position following the graduation of All-OVC stand-out Ron Downard. Westmoreland will have plenty of opportunity to prove himself.

GARY KELLY...Sophomore...5-11...175...Cleveland, Tenn...Kelly was used a good deal last season in a reserve role as a freshman. Based on his past performance as a reserve, and his showing in spring practice, he should be a big help this year.

WALTER HAWKINS...Sophomore...6-0...220...Elizabethtown, Ky...With his size, the "Hawk"could be a stopper in this position. He has the ability, but will need experience.

DAVID GROVES...Sophomore...6-0...180...Oak Ridge, Tenn...A fine prospect, Groves is still a little light for the position. If he can add some weight, he has the talent and the moves to play plenty.


#### QUARTERBACKS

JIM DAILY...Junior...6-4...New Albany, Indiana...One of the most talented members of the 1960 Western squad as a sophomore, Daily's fine passing ability accounted for a total of 693 yards and three touchdowns. An All-OVC honorable mention selection last year, Daily is expected to be a dangerous man at the helm for the Hilltoppers during the 1961 season.

BILL STRAUB... Junior... 5-7... 175... Ft. Thomas, Ky... A transfer student from the University of Kentucky, Straub will be on the Western team for the first time this year. He starred for Highlands, Kentucky, high school, and looked extremely talented during the Hilltoppers' spring drills. A quick, deceptive player, Straub is wise in the ways of quarterbacking.

JOE DRUGA...Sophomore...5-8...170...Louisville, Ky...Druga saw limited action last year as a freshman, but looked good in completing five of ten passes for 72 yards. With more experience, he could develop into a fine performer.

DUDLEY BERTHOLD...Sophomore...5-11...160...Louisville, Ky...As a reserve quarterback last year, Berthold flashed hot and cold. He looked sharp in connecting on a 75-yard touchdown pass play against Austin Peay. Experience will help.




WINTON BOONE

WINTON BOONE...Senior...6-0...170...Corbin, Ky...Known as the fastest back in the OVC, Boone does the one hundred in 9.8. Last season he accounted for 3.5 yards per carry and two touchdowns, proving he can go when he gets the ball.

LLOYD NASH...Senior...5-8...180...Owensboro, Ky...Second best ground gainer for Western last season with a 4.1 yards per carry average, Nash is a fine offensive threat. If he can work out academic difficulties, Nash will see lots of action.

BUZZY BEST...Junior...6-0...190...Elizabethtown, Ky...A little disappointing in his first season with Western last year after transferring from U.K., Best may now have the experience to go with his potential. Best averaged 3.3 yards per carry during the 1960 season, but he can do better. He was an All-OVC honorable mention selection last year.

JOHN BARWICK...Junior...5-10...180...Oak Ridge, Tenn...A graduate of Itawamba, Mississippi, Junior College, Barwick begins his first season with the Hilltoppers. He's listed as a fine defensive player who will add depth to the halfback position.


CARSON CULLER...Sophomore...5-10...170...Garrett, Ind...As a freshman last season, Culler played a lot of ball for Western and showed he has a great potential. If he continues to develop as expected, he can be one of the best.

#### FULLBACKS

GARY BRUNSON...Senior...5-9...170... Evansville, Ind...A hard-charging driver who means business when he's got the ball, Brunson was the Hilltoppers' leading groundgainer last year with a 4.4 average. A good all-round player, Brunson plays hard on both offense and defense.



BILLY BOOKER

BILLY BOOKER...Senior...6-0...190...Franklin, Ky...Western's top scorer last year with three touchdowns and a 3.3 yards per carry average, Booker knows the fullback slot. He's a powerful driver who can slash through the line for the extra yard, or back up the line equally well on defense.

BOBBY MITCHELL...Junior...5-7...165...Oak Ridge, Tenn...Making up in grit and determination for what he may lack in size, Mitchell is a fine fullback. He drives hard and is also an excellent punter, with the latter duty expected to be one of his main chores this fall.

JOE JAGGERS...Junior...6-1...185...Princeton, Ky...A very fine offensive threat, Jaggers has good speed and deceptive moves. Ineligible last year, Jaggers is sure to aid the Western cause during the 1961 season.

DICK HARPER...Junior...5-10...185...Lansdowne, Pa...A transfer from Lindsey Wilson Junior College, Harper is expected to provide needed depth at tackle. He is experienced, but may need time to adjust to the rugged OVCstyle football.
