University Center Board

There is no doubt that getting an education is your primary purpose for coming to Western, but college includes more than just attending class and going to the library. The University Center Board offers a wide range of experiences outside the classroom. Our primary purpose is to plan and present a variety of activities designed to serve the cultural, educational and social interests of all students enrolled at Western Kentucky University. Members of the University Center Board become involved in choosing programs sponsored on our campus and work to produce the events. Multiple opportunities exist for members to express creative thinking and exercise leadership skills!

There are openings for members on all U.C.B. committees, and all Western students are eligible and encouraged to apply for the committee of their choice. Lecture Committee

The Lecture Committee brings to campus well-known, thought-provoking speakers. These speakers discuss contemporary issues in their specialized fields. Lecturers include authors, politicians, scientists, entertainers and WKU faculty members. Past speakers have included James Baldwin, William F. Buckley, Dr. Carl Sagan, Dr. Timothy Leary, G. Gordon Liddy and former Beatle drummer Pete Best to name but a few. Lecture Committee members select the programs, help with publicity and act as hosts.

Concert Committee

The Concert Committee is involved in bringing to campus a wide range of musical programming by some of the best known professional entertainers available. Past artists have included The Fabulous Thunderbirds, The Church, Leon Redbone, Ratt, and Alabama, and the list could go on. Obviously there is something for everyone. Not only do we provide concert programming but sponsor a variety of dances and tailgating festivities during home football games. Committee members are involved in day of show production, public relations, and interaction with music professionals.

Special Events Committee

The Special Events Committee sponsors a wide variety of events to entertain all of the campus. These programs are planned throughout the year in the form of audience participation shows, variety acts, special event dances and festivals. Some of the more popular events include The Wild Video Dance Party, Hilloween, Splash Bash, Big Red's Roar and International Day. Special Events members use their creative talents to plan, schedule, decorate and publicize activities the student body can enjoy.

Public Relations

The Public Relations Committee organizes and publicizes all events sponsored by the University Center Board. Placing and laying out display ads, designing posters and flyers, writing news releases and producing videos when necessary are all part of this committee's responsibilities. The committee works as an in-house advertising agency where all facets of public relations are employed with skill and creativity. This year we have incorporated a video camera into our Public Relations Library for use in promoting our events.

Niteclass Committee

A new addition to the Downing University Center in 1988, Niteclass is a 250-seat non-alcoholic bar with dance floor, sound system, big screen T.V. and food and beverage capabilities. This committee implements various programs to supplement the already busy schedule in Niteclass. Some new ideas on our food service situation are being considered for Fall 1993, along with possible expansion of days and hours.

DUC 4th Floor Recreation Committee

Our newest addition to UCB Committee structure is the Rec-Floor committee. This committee is responsible for programming leagues, tournaments in billiards, pool, snooker, bowling, darts, ping-pong, etc. Various special nights are set aside each semester for savings on bowling and billiards, even video games. Special events with music and midnight movies are also scheduled each semester to coincide with activities on the rec-floor.
