WELCOME to the DOWNING UNIVERSITY CENTER

The four-story structure is a multi-purpose facility for the entire university community and houses the following:


First Floor - Post Office, offices for Food Services, Niteclass, offices of Student Government Association, computer lab, and MCI office.






Fourth Floor - A recreational center equipped with twelve bowling lanes, video games, billiards, table tennis, game tables, a large screen TV, plus concession and lounge area.


RECREATION CENTER


The Bowling Alley is equipped with twelve bowling lanes. Bowling is \$1.00 per game and \$.25 for shoe rental. The table tennis area is equipped with six tables. Ping Pong balls can be purchased for \$.25.

Hours: Seven days a week from 1:00 p.m. - 11:00 p.m.

The Arcade Area is equipped with the latest video games, pinball machines, and foosball tables. Games are \$.25 and \$.50 per play. The Billiards Area is equipped with 18 billiards tables, 2 bumper pool tables, and 2 snooker tables. The billiards rate is \$1.30 per hour per table. Hours: Monday - Friday 10:30 a.m. - 11:00 p.m., Saturday - Sunday 1:00 p.m. - 11:00 p.m.

A Lounge and Concession Area, located in the center of the recreational area, has vending machines, a large screen TV, games tables, and lounge/study areas. DUC THEATRE

The 750-seat Center Theatre, located on the main floor of the Downing University Center, shows contemporary movies Tuesday through Saturday at 7:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. Admission is \$2.00.

The DUC Management is offering season passes for the 1992-93 year for \$25.00 per person, \$50.00 per couple, and \$5.00 for each additional family member. This will allow you admittance to all regularly scheduled movies and can save you approximately 60% off the regular price of admission. STUDENT ACTIVITIES AND ORGANIZATIONS

Located in room 326 of DUC, the Office of Student Activities and Organizations is easily accessible to students. The office's primary mission is to enhance student life and development by facilitating student involvement in organizations, providing broadly based programs of entertainment and activities, and presenting opportunities to develop leadership, social, organizational and interpersonal skills. The office serves as the registration process of groups desiring official university recognition. In addition to advising the groups mentioned above, the office performs a variety of others services. Organizations files and updates are maintained; resource information and hot topic ideas are available; and staff members perform a variety of leadership workshops upon request. The staff takes great pride in working with student leaders and other university offices toward the continuous improvement of W.K.U. student life.

UNIVERSITY CENTER BOARD

The University Center Board, through its six committees, has the responsibility for planning and presenting a campus-wide program of activities in the following areas: music (all types), lectures, special events, leisure learning activities and cultural programs. U.C.B. serves in an advisory capacity to the university center personnel and the office of Student Activities. U.C.B. is composed of student leaders selected by various organizations, faculty and staff. The program committees are composed of students appointed and elected by U.C.B. The board's office is located in room 330 of DUC.
