Tiered Parking Plan for Residents

February 12<sup>th</sup>, 2007

PURPOSE: For the Student Government Association of Western Kentucky University to support the move to a Tiered Parking Plan for Residents as suggested by the Parking and Transportation Department.

WHEREAS: The Tiered Parking Plan would be composed of three tiered parking zones: "Housing Premium Zones", "Housing Non-Premium Zones", and overflow "All Permits Zones", and

WHEREAS: Sales are limited to the capacity of the "Premium Housing Zone", and

WHEREAS: The fee for "Premium Housing Zone" is \$175/year, and

WHEREAS: "Housing Premium Zone" permits are accepted in the "Housing Non-Premium Zone" and "All Permits Zones" should the "Housing Premium Zone" become full, and

WHEREAS: "Housing Non-Premium" permits sales are unlimited, and

WHEREAS: The fee for "Housing Non-Premium" remains \$85/ year, and

WHEREAS: Parking is allowed in "Housing Premium Zone" on a first come, first served basis, and.

WHEREAS: "Housing Premium Zones" are indicated in the attached campus map, and

WHEREAS: Permit zones are enforced Sunday, 3:30 PM through Friday 3:30 PM, and

WHEREAS: Permit zones are open Friday afternoon through Sunday afternoon, and

WHEREAS: At all times, loading and unloading is provided at the meters outside each residence hall, and

WHEREAS: The Tiered Parking Plan is modeled after Faculty/Staff Premium and Non-Premium Parking Zones.

WHEREAS: Tiered Parking is the correct economical solution to handling our residence's parking shortage, and

WHEREAS: Tiered Parking will ensure that those students who desire premium parking will have access to it.

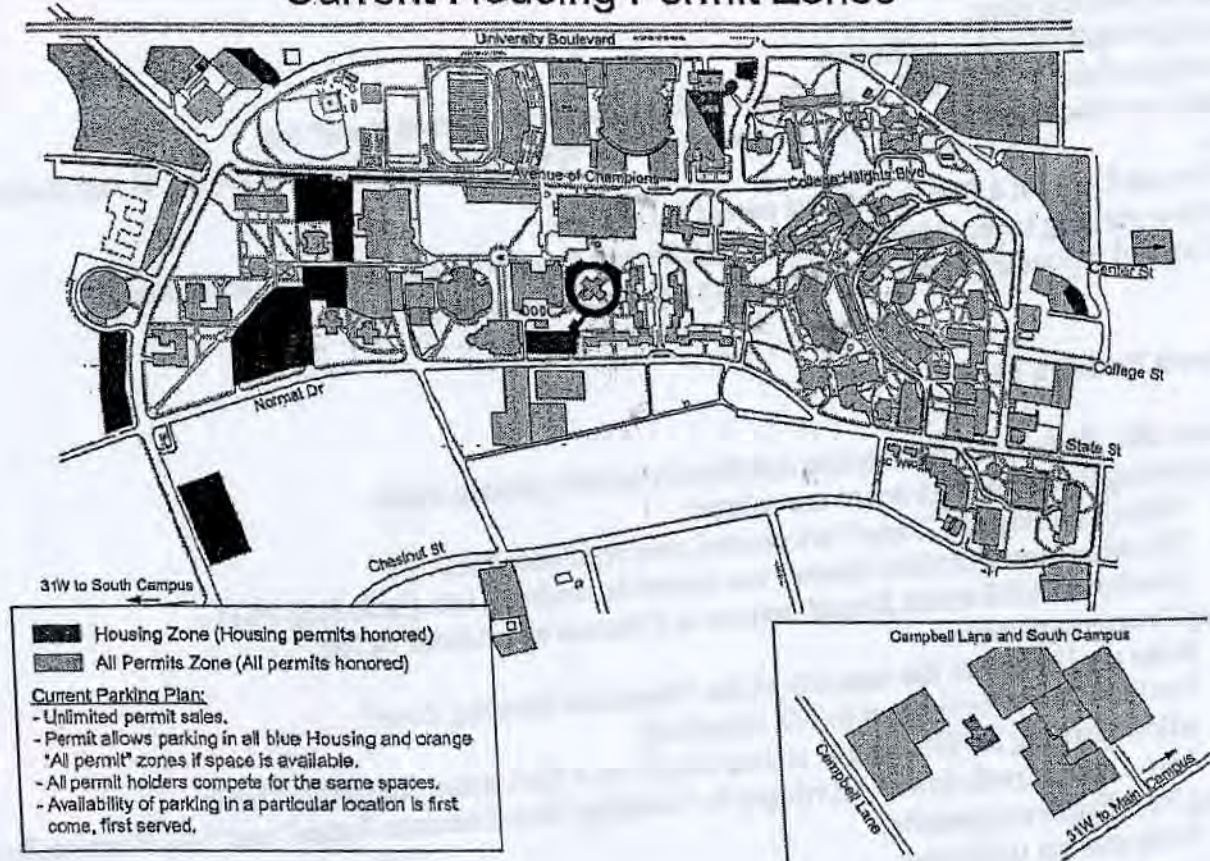

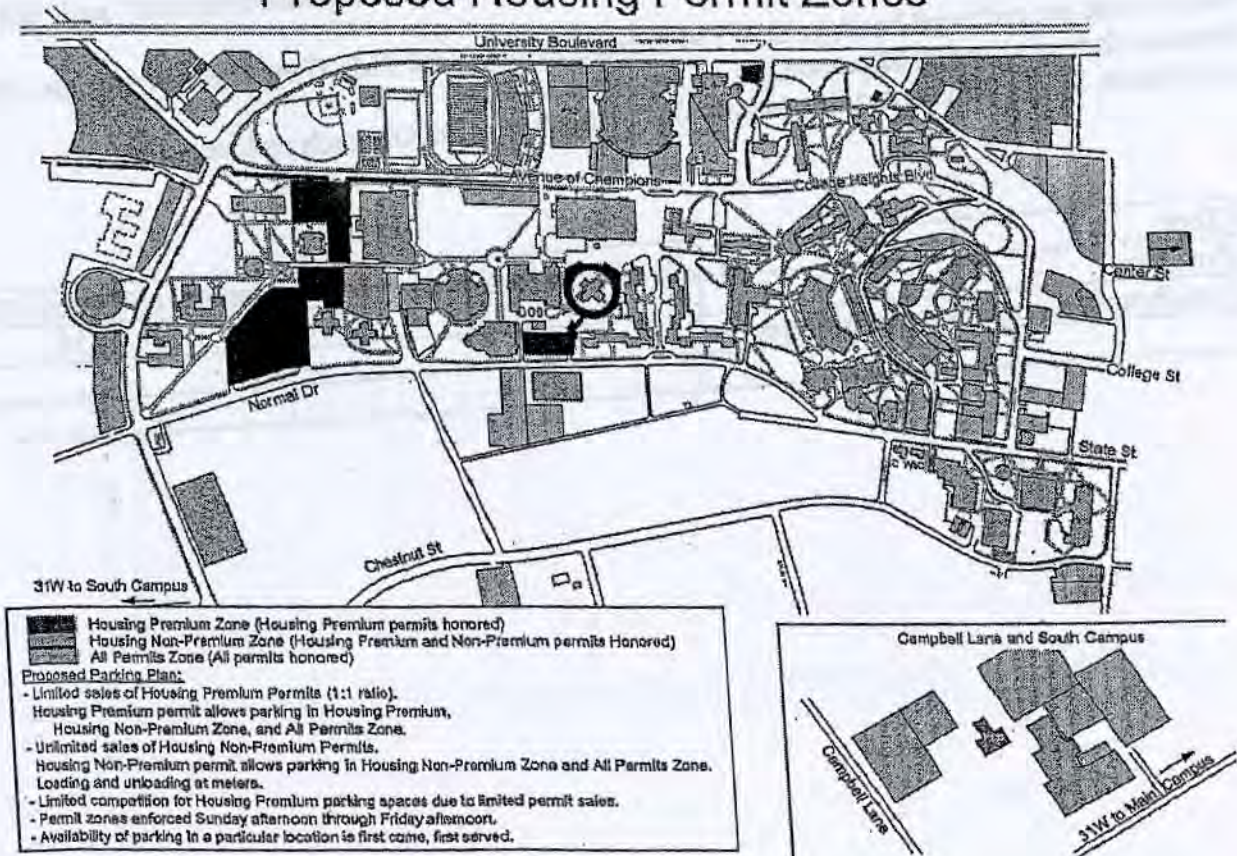

## Current Parking Plan

Under the current parking plan:

- Housing permit sales are unlimited.
- Housing permits are honored in all "Housing Zone" and "All Permit Zone" lots.
- Permits are "hunting licenses" with no guarantee that space will be available in any lot at any particular time.
- All lots are filled on a first come, first served basis.
- Overflow parking is provided in outlying "All Permit Zones" where all permits are honored.
- Loading and unloading is provided at meters outside each residence hall.

## Proposed Tiered Parking Plan

- Modeled after Faculty/Staff Premium and Non-Premium parking zones.
- The following tiered parking zones are created:
  - "Housing Premium Zones" are created near residence halls.
  - "Housing Non-Premium Zones" are created in outlying lots (including PS1).
  - Overflow "All Permits Zones" remain in Creason and Adams St lots.
- Housing Premium permits:
  - Sales are limited to the capacity of the "Premium Housing Zone".
  - Fee is \$175/yr (equivalent to F/S Premium)
  - Allow parking in "Housing Premium Zone" on a first come, first served basis.
  - Also allows "park down" privileges in "Housing Non-Premium Zones" and "All Permits Zones"
- Housing Non-Premium permits:
  - Sales remain unlimited.
  - Fee remains \$85 (equivalent to F/S Non-Premium)
  - Parking available on a first come, first served basis in "Housing Non-Premium" and "All Permit Zones" only.
- Permit zones are enforced Sunday, 3:30 PM through Friday, 3:30 PM. (Permit zones are open Friday afternoon through Sunday afternoon.)
- At all times, loading and unloading is provided at the meters outside each residence hall.
