Resolution 79-14 Housing Improvements Research Introduced 1/22/80

Status PASSED Unanimously

- Whereas, the available married housing has declined over the past several years from a level which had already been considered deficient, and
- Whereas, the feelings toward co-ed housing are varied among the student body (i.e. Resolution 79-9 passed by only one vote in Congress and failed in IHC); however, not detracting from the need for future studies and research to be done in this area by the Administration, and
- Whereas, with the various problems with student organizations in obtaining proper zoning for off-campus housing facilities and other related problems, and
- Whereas, existing facilities (i.e. dorms) should be continually reviewed for possible alterations which might increase their desirablilty by the students, especially in the wake of possible enrollment declines, and
- Whereas, constant communications with Western's benchmark institutions should be expanded in order to find possible solutions to the above problems and others that might be of interest to the student body,
- Therefore, be it resolved that Western Kentucky University take a more active role in researching the possibilities and feasibility of improving the existing housing situations, along with a greater emphasis placed on possible changes in various trends.
 - Furthermore, that the action come by way of the University Housing Committee and the University Office of Student Affairs which includes the Housing Office.
 - Also, let it be emphasized that presently the University Housing Office does not have the manpower to facilitate such research and development, thus creating a need for other arrangements within the Office of Student Affairs.
