MINUTES

COUNCIL OF ACADEMIC DEANS

June 2, 1975

The Council of Academic Deans met on Monday, June 2, 1975, at 1:30 p.m. in the Office of Academic Affairs. Present were Deans Cravens, Hardin, Sandefur, Sutton, Robinson, Chelf, Mounce, Oppitz, Stroube, and Davis. Mr. Mike Rush represented Dr. Hourigan at the meeting.

The Deans approved the proposed dates for their summer meetings. The regular meetings of the Council of Academic Deans will be held on:

Each meeting will be held at 10:00 a.m. in the Office of Academic Affairs with the exception of the June 9 meeting which will be tentatively held at 1:30 p.m. in Room 120 of Diddle Arena.

Dr. Sutton commented on the Policy for Transfer of Credits from Community and Junior Colleges to Western Kentucky University. Dr. Cravens asked the deans to contact him by Thursday, June 5, if they saw any problem in this policy.

The Proposed Guidelines on Institutional ceu's were discussed. The item will be put back on the agenda of the next deans' meeting.

The deans commented on the KET courses. Decisions will need to be made within several weeks on these courses. This item will be discussed at a future meeting of the deans.

Dr. Chelf submitted a proposal concerning 300 - and 400-level courses which might be part of an associate degree curriculum. The deans approved the following proposal:

"Although courses numbered 300-499 are open primarily to juniors and seniors, these courses may be included as a part of an associate degree curriculum when they provide specific training needed in a particular program."
