Article II

Section 4

Clause A: The Student Government Association Web Page

The main duty of the Information Technology Director will be to maintain the web page of the Student Government Association. Guidelines for the purpose for and maintenance of the web page are as follows:

- The web page will have a news section with information on issues that are pertinent to the students; this section will be updated at least once a month (not including June or July) so that it may address new issues in a timely manner.
- The web page will have current events section to keep the students informed on upcoming Student
 Government and University events; this section will be updated at least once a month (not including
 June or July) so that it may communicate upcoming events well in advance.
- The web page will include a section that describes the three branches of the Student Government
 Organization and of the Constitutional Committees; this section will be updated at least once a month
 to include new information.
- The web page will not endorse, in any way, any outside organization that seeks to profit from the students of Western Kentucky University.
