Recreation Area Renovation to be completed by Fall 1999

In April 1998, the roof on the Downing University Center caved in due to excessive hail and water damage from a severe storm. The entire fourth floor was flooded, as well as several other areas of the building. The fourth floor had to be largely gutted to remove water-damaged materials. Most of the billiards area was closed off until we determined how to proceed, but the remaining bowling area was opened in a temporary mode to accommodate our students.

After a moisture-control system was used to remove excess water from the bowling lanes, the lanes were resurfaced for use by bowling classes and leisure recreation. The carpet was

replaced in this area and a smaller billiards area and video games area was made available. The restrooms and concessions area also remained open.

Other areas of the building that were flooded included the theatre and stage, the mezzanine, and several offices and meeting rooms. The carpet and walls in these areas had to be thoroughly cleaned because of mold buildup and several rooms received new carpet and paint.

After much discussion, we have decided to continue to use the fourth floor for leisure-time recreational activities, such as billiards, bowling, dancing, and socializing.

We have finally settled with the insurance company and now have begun the process to remodel our recreation area. Luckett & Farley, an architectural-engineering firm from

Louisville, Kentucky, has been hired to design and provide assistance for the renovation process. Luckett & Farley is challenged with designing a 24,000 square foot recreational area with durable and pleasing finishes--all with a limited budget and timeframe. Our projected grand opening date is scheduled to be in August 1999. Several specific areas we have requested for them to include is a refurbished/updated billiards area, a table tennis area, a new dance floor with DJ booth and sound equipment, a newly decorated bowling area, and a large video arcade.
