ORGANIZATIONAL HISTORY

Smiths Grove, Kentucky is located in northeastern Warren County and was incorporated by the Kentucky General Assembly in 1871, however a community had existed there for decades. The town was purportedly named for a grove of trees on a small knob west of town. Urias Rasdall is credited with having the community surveyed and platted. The town was located near the Louisville & Nashville Turnpike, on the mainline of the Louisville & Nashville Railroad, and within one mile of Interstate 65. These evolving transportation routes created access to markets for area farmers. This area still relies chiefly on agriculture for its economy; the chief agricultural products are forage crops, wheat, tobacco and beef cattle. In the past the area also yielded significant strawberry harvests and had several flourishing dairies.

Smiths Grove College was established by W. W. Beck in 1875. A commodious, two-story frame building was constructed for the school on College Street, between 4th and 5th Streets. This school was sold to the Methodist Church in 1901 and renamed the Smiths Grove Training School for Vanderbilt University or more commonly known as the Vanderbilt Training School. In 1910 it was purchased by the Warren Association of Baptists and named Warren Baptist Academy. All the secondary schools in the community were eventually consolidated into Smiths Grove High School. This school and Oakland High School consolidated in 1941 and was renamed North Warren High School. When Warren East High School was completed in 1969, there was a movement to keep North Warren High School in Smiths Grove, but it was unsuccessful. North Warren Elementary School is still located on the original land used by Smiths Grove College.

Smiths Grove boasts several homes and churches of architectural significance, as well as a large cemetery (originally administered by the Odd Fellows) and a number of large and productive farms. The present city hall was built in 1946 and houses most city functions. The population of the community remained static during the latter half of the twentieth century, around 750 residents.

COLLECTION NOTE

This small collection contains information about Smiths Grove history, people, churches, schools, and events. A biography folder contains small items related to people from the Smiths Grove area. Additional folders contain more extensive information about three individuals: Virginia Stockton (Beck) Helm, David Maury Helm, and Virginia Wood Davis. In relation to the history of education in the community, the collection includes information about a failed movement (Save Our School) to keep a high school in Smiths Grove in the 1960s and a record book containing the Smiths Grove College Board of Trustees minutes, 1884-1901.
