

Coach JIM PICKENS



Jim Pickens is in his fifth season as head coach of the Hilltoppers. Both his background and experience fit him ably for the assignment.

The Princeton, Kentucky, native was a star pitcher, as well as an outstanding football quarterback, for Western Kentucky in his collegiate playing days. He later pitched professionally as a member of the Detroit Tigers' organization.

Pickens came to Western in the fall of 1965 after a sparkling coaching career in the high school ranks, where he fashioned championship teams in both baseball and football. In six seasons at Bowling Green High School, his baseball teams won 118 games while losing only 20, a percentage of .855. He climaxed his coaching stint there by guiding the Purples to the State Championship in 1965.

Before coaching at Bowling Green, Pickens held similar positions at Danville and Elizabethtown High Schools. Over a 15-year span, his high school baseball teams won 221 victories against just 59 losses, a .789 percentage.

After suffering through three lean years at Western due to inexperience and a lack of solid hitting, Pickens' 1968 squad posted a 13-11 season and a second place finish in the Ohio Valley Conference's Western Division race. Last year the Hilltoppers registered a 17-11 worksheet and won 10 of eleven OVC games to claim their Division title.

Pickens' overall record, going into the current campaign, showed 52 wins, 49 losses and two ties.

In addition to his coaching duties, Pickens is Director of University Centers. He received the B.S. and M.A. degrees from Western in 1951 and 1962, respectively.

He and his wife, Ann, a former Hilltopper cheerleader, have one son, Jimmy, Jr. 10.

1970 OUTLOOK

Hilltopper diamond fortunes have been steadily rising since Jim Pickens came to the Western helm. Last spring's team won the Ohio Valley Conference's Western Division before dropping the championship playoff to powerful Morehead.

Graduation hurt the Toppers, but the key to a successful season will be Western's ability to replace two unexpected absentees on the roster. All-OVC catcher John Vance decided this spring to bypass his final year of baseball eligibility and sign a pro contract with the Pittsburgh Pirates. And, Bill Bathurst, counted on to be one of the mainstays of the Western mound staff, suffered an injury to his throwing arm.

Nevertheless, Pickens feels that the 1970 squad, led by the sparkling all-around ability of All-OVC outfielder Harry Jones, will have to be reckoned with. Jones led the 1969 team in four statistical categories and batted a healthy .317.

Pickens forecasts that his outfield of Jones, Jim Zwiesler and Jay Davis will be as strong defensively as any in college ball. Zwiesler led last year's squad in doubles, triples and total bases and he hit at a .352 clip.

The return of Neil Lawson, after sitting out a year, should bolster the infield. Pickens also looks for strong performances from top-notch freshmen Marty Braun and Jack Glasser. Braun is a shortstop and Glasser, a catcher, might help solve the vacancy behind the plate.

Graduation cost the pitching staff the services of All-OVC Stan Markham, as well as Alan Hapney and Elliott Miles. However, two fine returnees and a transfer should form the nucleus of a good mound corps. Don Durham and lefty Phil Van Meter will be back in uniform and Jim Howes, a big hard-throwing righthander, will join the Hilltoppers.
