#### Coach JIM PICKENS



Jim Pickens is in his sixth season as head coach of the Hilltoppers. Both his background and experience fit him ably for the assignment.

The Princeton, Kentucky, native was a star pitcher, as well as an outstanding football quarterback, for Western Kentucky in his collegiate playing days. He later pitched professionally as a member of the Detroit Tigers' organization.

Pickens came to Western in the fall of 1965 after a sparkling coaching career in the high school ranks, where he fashioned championship teams in both baseball and football. In six seasons at Bowling Green High School, his baseball teams won 118 games while losing only 20, a percentage of .855. He climaxed his coaching stint there by guiding the Purples to the State Championship in 1965.

Before coaching at Bowling Green, Pickens held similar positions at Danville and Elizabethtown High Schools. Over a 15-year span, his high school teams won 221 victories against just 59 losses, a .789 percentage.

After suffering through three rather lean seasons in rebuilding Western's baseball fortunes, Pickens' last three Hilltopper clubs have been among the most respected in the OVC. His 1969 team won the Western Division championship and last year's team had an overall 18-16-1 record.

Pickens' overall record, going into the current campaign, showed 70 wins, 65 losses and three ties.

In addition to his coaching duties, Pickens is Director of University Centers. He received the B. S. and M. A. degrees from Western in 1951 and 1962, respectively.

Pickens is assisted by Lee Murray, who also serves as assistant football coach and who was a former star for the Hilltoppers in both sports.

#### 1971 OUTLOOK

Graduation and other losses from the 1970 squad meant the departure of some extremely gifted individuals from Western's baseball crew, although Coach Jim Pickens feels he has solid nucleus around which to build.

Gone are outfielder Harry Jones, who hit .368 a year ago; infielder Mike Coberly, a .346 hitter; and pitcher Don Durham, who signed a professional contract with the St. Louis Cardinals after compiling a 6-2 record, a 2.78 ERA and ranking among the nation's top strikeout artists with 80 in 55 innings. He also hit .418 as a pitcher and first becomen

Leading the returnees are outfielder Jim Zweisler (.345), catcher Jack Glasser (.300), experienced infielders Jay Hickman (.239) and Barrett Bernard (.118), and pitchers Leonard Mullins (3-1, 0.87 ERA), Phil Van Meter (3-4, 4.60) and Ron Brosnon (3-4, 4.50).

The mound corps will be strenthened overall by the addition of newcomers like Greg Stahl.

Overall, Pickens feels his club can be stronger defensively this season, almost comparable to last year's team in pitching, but with hitting something of a question mark.

"Our hitting potential looks fairly solid," Pickens explained, "but much of it is relatively inexperienced and it remains to be seen if we can put together the offensive punch when we need it."


