### JIM PICKENS

#### Head Coach



Jim Pickens enjoyed one of the best seasons in his nine years of coaching the Hilltoppers this past spring. His squad finished the season with a 18-11 record and placed third in its division. The Hilltoppers were in contention for the Western Division spring title until the closing game of the season.

Entering his tenth year at the helm of the Hilltoppers, Pickens has a lifetime record of 148 wins, 136 losses for a winning percentage of .521.

After suffering through three rather lean seasons in rebuilding Western's baseball fortunes, Pickens' last six Hilltopper clubs have been among the most respected in the OVC. His 1969 team won the Western Division championship.

Pickens' baseball background is a solid one. He was a star pitcher, as well as an outstanding football quarterback and defensive back, for Western in his collegiate playing days. Later, the Princeton, Ky., native pitched professionally in the Detroit Tigers' organization.

Pickens came to Western in the fall of 1965 after a sparkling coaching career in the high school ranks, where he fashioned championship teams in both baseball and football. In six seasons at Bowling Green High School, his baseball teams won 118 games while losing 20, a percentage of .855. He climaxed his coaching stint there by guiding the Purples to the State Championship in 1965.

Before coaching at Bowling Green, Pickens held similar positions at Danville and Elizabethtown High Schools. Over a 15-year span, his high school teams won 221 victories against just 59 losses, a .789 percentage.

In addition to his coaching duties, Pickens is Director of University Centers, a position he has held since 1970. He received the B.S. and M.A. degrees from Western in 1951 and 1962, respectively. He and his wife, Anna Jo, a former Hilltopper cheerleader, have one son, Jimmy, 15.

#### **BUCK SYDNOR** Assistant Coach



Buck Sydnor's experience and knowledge of the game have been definite factors in Western Kentucky University's baseball success the past few seasons.

He became Jim Pickens' assistant coach in the spring of 1972 after spending six seasons as a basketball assistant under John Oldham.

Sydnor, a native of Olmstead, Kv., was a star on Western's first two National Invitation Tournament basketball teams in 1942 and 1943.

Before returning to Western as a coach, Sydnor was a vetern of 15 years of high school basketball

coaching at Daviess County, Hopkinsville, and Bowling Green High Schools. He coached 13 years at Daviess County, taking the Panthers to the State Tournament in 1952, 1957 and 1958. In his one year at Bowling Green, Sydnor brought the Purples home a winner with an 18-9 won-lost record after they had won only eight games the previous season.

Under Oldham at Western, Sydnor was in charge of the freshmen teams. His basketball freshmen, over six seasons (1956-71), won 62 and lost 50 while playing some of the toughest schedules ever faced by the Western frosh.

Sydnor received his B.S. and M.A. degrees from Western in 1948 and 1949, respectively. He and his wife, Deane, have four children.

## 1974 FALL AND 1975 SPRING OUTLOOK

Just as he has been in nine previous seasons, Western Head Coach Jim Pickens is optimistic about the outlook for his Hilltoppers during 1974-75. Pickens enjoyed one of his best seasons last spring when his squad finished the season with an 18-11 record.

But gone from the squad are five pitchers. Three of the five, Mike Grubb, Marty Matusiak and Greg Stahl, were starters. Pickens added, "We also lost two fine relief men in the Parrent twins, Rick and Rob." Matusiak was the workhorse of the pitching staff with a total of 38 2/3 innings. He had a 5-3 record and a team-leading 44 strikeouts.

"We feel our defense is sound enough in the infield if we can come up with a strong third baseman," said Pickens. Coming back are Neil Mills, the ALL-OVC second baseman, and Dee Deener. Pickens said Deener had a fine season last year as a freshman shortstop. Mills was the second leading hitter on the squad last season with a .365 batting average. Deener batted .320 with 22 runs batted in. Bill Moore will return to help at first base and see some action on the mound.

The outfield is led by

centerfielder Steve Keck. He was the leading hitter on the squad, banging out 34 hits in 92 at-bats for a .370 average. Pickens feels that he has a number of fine outfielders to flank Keck. Returning are Mike Hurst, Terry Mitchell, Gary Larimore, Mike Parker and

The catching should be improved, with Dave Carter, Jimmy Feix, Wally Moss and Hurst all returning. Carter was the squad's third leading hitter with an average of .354. He led the squad in RBIs with 24 and doubles with eight. But the talented athlete is also the Hilltoppers' starting center in football and will miss the fall diamond action.

"The big question mark for our club will be in the pitching department," said Pickens. "In Steve Carter, Jeff Ralph, Rev Ford and Moore, we have adequate strength, but we still could use some immediate help from our incoming freshmen."



#### Steve Keck Centerfield


