ACCIDENT INSURANCE PROVIDED BY COLLEGE

As the College has continued to study ways and means by which it can contribute to the welfare of the faculty and staff, serious consideration has been given to providing accident insurance which will cover members of the faculty and staff in official travel status as representatives of the College.

I am pleased to notify you that such a policy was taken with the Aetna Life Insurance Company effective July 1, 1964. It is our hope that there will never be cause to use this insurance; however, it is a benefit which Western is providing for the welfare and protection of you and your family.

The conditions of the coverage which this policy provides are too extensive to enumerate here. Briefly, it is this: In the event of injury or death resulting from an accident incurred by a member of the faculty and staff while in official travel as a representative of the College, the individual or his beneficiary may be paid an indemnity up to \$100,000.0 and/or medical expenses up to \$5,000.00. Medical expenses are subject to a \$50.00 deductible. It is necessary that such accidents be reported promptly and accurately. Please feel free to consult with the Business Office for additional information regarding this matter.
