NCATE SELF-STUDY

The College has officially begun the self-evaluation of the teacher education program in preparation for the visitation by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education next fall. Dr. Charles Clark of the Department of Education has been appointed Director of the study. Dr. John D. Minton has been designated Coordinator of the Graduate Program Evaluation.

Within the next few days the Steering Committee, composed of Dr. Raymond L. Cravens, Chairman; Dr. Charles Clark, Dean Dero Downing, Dr. William R. Hourigan, Mr. Rhea Lazarus, Dr. John D. Minton, and Dr. Tate C. Page, will be in contact with many of you requesting that you serve on the committees which will compile reports on the Standards of the accrediting agency.

The time available for the completion of this important study is limited; therefore, faculty members serving on committees will be involved in quite a bit of additional work this and next semester. Our best efforts toward the completion of assignments during the study will be necessary. This will be one of our most important projects for the 1964-65 school year.
