Commencement. Commencement exercises will be held in the Western stadium (hillstop) on Friday, August 9, at 7:30 p.m. The commencement address will be given by Dr. Raymond Gibson, Professor of Higher Education at Indiana University and a distinguished alumnus of Western. The committee coordinating the processional has requested that the faculty assemble at 7 o'clock on the bridge entrance to the Finley G. Grise Hall and form lines on the sidewalk leading to the press box. Deans Robert G, Cochran and Charles A. Keown will be in charge of the processional. They have requested that the following plan be observed:

Line No. 1 Persons whose last names begin with
(left) "A" through "J"

Line No. 2 Persons whose last names begin with (right) "K" through "Z"

The lines of march will form the academic processional which result in the honor guard on the football field, similar to that which has been followed in the past.

Active participation by all is vital to the success of the commencement program. In the event of inclement weather, the exercises will be held in the Academic-Athletic Bullding and E. A. Diddle Arena. Any member of the faculty who has not arranged for the proper academic attire should see Mr. James L. Hall. manager of the College Heights Bookstore, as soon as possible.
