
Dear Dr. Wilder,



SUBJECT: Residence Hall Sprinkler Systems

Please be advised that Western Kentucky University is in the process of requesting approval to issue bonds which will allow the university to fund a sprinkler system project. Upon the completion of this project, Western Kentucky University would be in compliance with the State Fire Marshall's request, and would have followed the instructions received from the Council on Postsecondary Education.

The immediate attention which this project is receiving will cause us to reprioritize other planned residence hall improvements. It is anticipated that this project will cost between 3.5 and four million dollars. Once we have a more specific set of figures, we will schedule a meeting with members of the Student Government Association to give you a better understanding of the impact of the project.
