BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Elizabeth Cook, a native of Mt. Eden, Kentucky, earned a bachelor's degree in education from Western Kentucky State Teachers College in 1941. After graduation she moved back to Mt. Eden and taught grade school and later high school. She was a member of the Baptist church and was noted for her strong faith.

COLLECTION NOTE

This collection consists almost exclusively of letters written by young men to Elizabeth Charlotte Cook, when she attended Campbellsville College, Campbellsville, Kentucky, 1939-1940, and then Western Kentucky State Teachers College, Bowling Green, Kentucky, 1940-1944. Three men who wrote her frequently: Arless Bowman, Jonnie Eadens, and Alfred L. Mattos. Arless Bowman enlisted on January 1942 in the Marine Corps. Elizabeth and Alfred L. Mattos were good friends and he wrote her about 60 letters. Richard Johnson and Elizabeth grew up in Mt. Eden together, although he was a few years her senior. Richard was in the Army from 1942 to 1943, and in 1943 he became a prisoner of war in Germany. Roy H. Gunter, a friend of Elizabeth from home, was in the military from 1941 to 1942; he wrote her about 60 letters. John Garner and Elizabeth were old classmates. He was in the army from 1940 to 1945, serving a portion of his time in France. Samuel E. Vance was in the military from 1942 to 1944 and was stationed in the South Pacific Islands. This collection also includes several Christmas and Valentine cards.

All the letters were removed from envelopes and numbered and then sorted and placed in acid-free folders alphabetically by the correspondent.
