Western State College will graduate 361 students this year. Of this number, 191 will receive degrees at the spring commencement exercises scheduled for Western stadium, June 3, at 7:30 p.m.

The remaining 1954 graduates will receive degrees at the summer commencement exercises to be held Aug. 4 at the close of the eight - week summer term.
