PLEDGE REQUIREMENTS BETA ZETA CHAPTER

1991

*Pledge Class*

Length - 8 weeks

1 week of neophyte

Pledgeship begins on Feb. 10th - Sun. and ends on April 6th Sun.

Neophyte from April 7-13

Initiation into active membership will be April 14th. Sun.

Dues - \$50.00

Can be paid all at once or in installments. Payment plans are to be devised by pledge and treasurer and put in pledges "file". Must pay a \$10.00 initiation fee on Feb. 10th. Must be paid in full before being considered for active membership.

An installment fee of \$25.00 will be required at the initiation into active membership.

MONEY PAID IS NON - REFUNDABLE!!!

REQUIREMENTS

There are two important aspects of individual concern that should be paid close attention to when pledging.

1. ATTITUDE - HAVE A GOOD ONE!!! Pledges should exhibit a positive attitude at all times. They should also show respect to the actives and each other.
2. RESPONSIBILITY - TAKE IT UPON YOURSELF!!! Take your role in the fraternity seriously and do what is asked of you.

THE NITTY GRITTY

1. Meetings - Pledges will be required to attend two weekly meetings. The pledge meeting at 6:00 pm and the regular weekly business meeting of the Xi Psi chapter at 7:00 pm -- both on Sunday nights. Attendance is mandatory at both meetings. Tardiness that is unexcused will result in demerits. If you are going to be absent or tardy, the pledge educator must be notified at least 3 hrs. in advance. Absence will not be tolerated. One absence will result in action.
2. Pledgebooks - Must be carried at all times. Pledgebooks will help pledges in getting to know the actives and recording their service hrs. and other information. Pledges must ~~have~~ <sup>keep</sup> their book to any active who requests it. Each pledge book has certain information that is required to be in it.

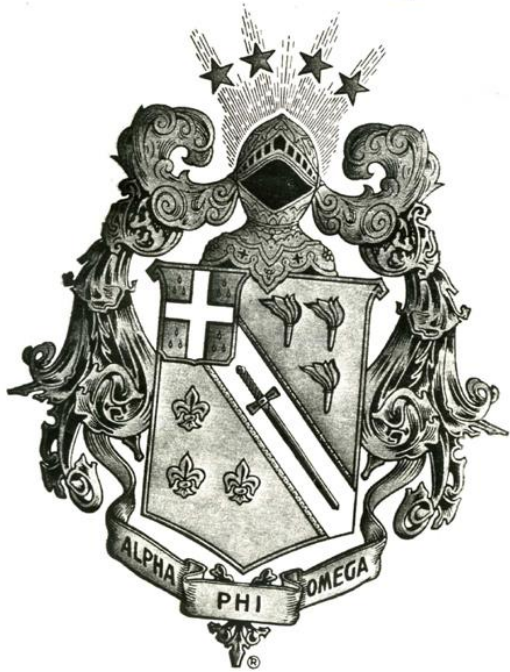

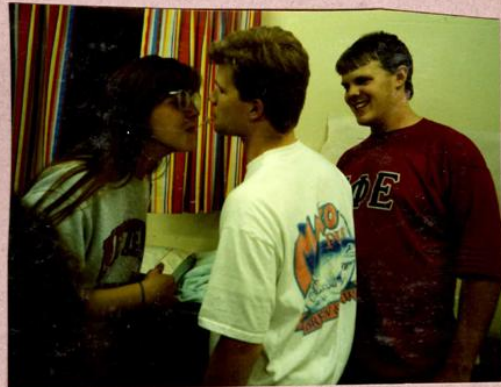

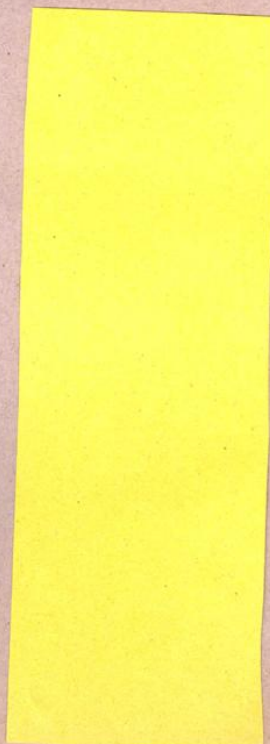
