## PADUCAH CONFERENCE

The Landmark Association staff attended the June 6, 1981, Jackson Purchase Regional Meeting of the Historical Confederation of Kentucky. This conference on "The Logic of Preservation" was sponsored by the Kentucky Heritage Commission, Paducah-McCracken County Growth, Inc. and the Society for the Preservation of Paducah.

A walking tour of the lower town neighborhood in Paducah was followed by presentations from Anne Thompson of the Kentucky Heritage Commission, Dick Pfefferkorn of Landmark, James Segrest of The Butchertown Neighborhood Association in Louisville and Doug Stern, City Historic Preservation Planner, of Evansville, Indiana. These programs focused upon the Revitalization/ Economic Development approaches used by the various organizations in connection with historic preservation.
