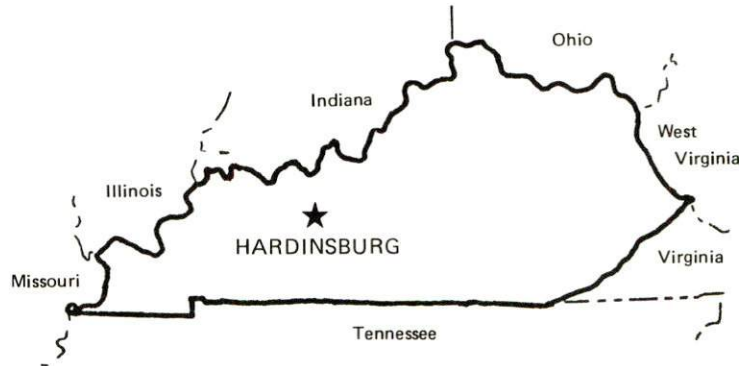

LABOR ORGANIZATIONS:

Amalgamated Clothing and Textile Workers Union represents manufacturing workers at American Olean Tile Company.

TRANSPORTATION:

Rail: The Louisville and Nashville Railroad Company serves Cloverport and Irvington. Cloverport services include one local freight Monday through Saturday, two northbound and two southbound through freights daily; switching facilities; siding space for two cars; and nearest piggyback facilities in Owensboro, 33 miles away. Irvington services include one northbound and one southbound local daily; two northbound and two southbound through freights daily; switching facilities; siding space for four cars; and nearest piggyback facilities in Louisville, 48 miles away.

Highways: U.S. Highway 60 connects Cloverport, Hardinsburg and Irvington. The Western Kentucky Parkway, 33 miles south of Hardinsburg, is accessible via Kentucky Highway 79.

Truck: Overnite Transportation Company and Robbins Truck Line, Inc. serve Hardinsburg, Cloverport and Irvington. In addition, McLean Trucking Company serves Hardinsburg and Cloverport. Black Motor Lines serves Hardinsburg and Irvington. McLean Trucking Company and Overnite Transportation Company provide interstate service only. Robbins Truck Line, Inc. and Black Motor Lines have local terminals in Hardinsburg.

Water: The Ohio River forms the north-northwestern boundary of Breckinridge County. Hardinsburg is approximately 47 miles from the Owensboro riverport.

Air: Breckinridge County Airport near Hardinsburg, has one paved, 3,500 foot, runway. Owensboro-Daviess County Airport, 47 miles from Hardinsburg, has 2 paved runways and is served by Air Kentucky (commuter airlines).

UTILITIES:

Electricity: Hardinsburg, Cloverport, Irvington and Breckinridge County are served by Meade County RECC.

Natural Gas: Western Kentucky Gas Company, serving Hardinsburg and Cloverport, and Valley Gas, Inc., serving Irvington, are supplied by Texas Gas Transmission Corporation.

Other Fuels: There are two propane and two distillate fuel oil distributors in Hardinsburg, and also one propane distributor in Irvington.

WATER AND SEWERAGE:

Water: Hardinsburg Municipal Water Works serves Hardinsburg. The treatment plant capacity is 300,000 gpd and peak daily consumption is 250,000 gallons. The storage capacity is 310,000 gallons. Cloverport Municipal Water and Sewer Company serves Cloverport. The treatment plant capacity is 500,000 gpd and peak daily consumption is 225,000 gallons. The storage capacity is 118,000 gallons. Irvington Water Works serves Irvington and the treatment plant capacity is 265,000 gpd. The peak daily consumption is 170,000 gallons and storage capacity is 200,000 gallons.

Sewerage: Hardinsburg Municipal Water Works serves Hardinsburg. The treatment plant has a capacity of 250,000 gpd. The average daily flow is 200,000 gallons and treatment is primary and secondary. Cloverport Municipal Water and Sewer Company serves Cloverport. The treatment plant has a capacity of 200,000 gpd. The average daily flow is 70,000 gallons and treatment is primary and secondary. Irvington has no municipal sewerage system at present; a 201 Facilities Study has been approved.

GOVERNMENT STRUCTURE:

City: Hardinsburg, Cloverport and Irvington are each served by a mayor elected for a 4-year term and 6 councilmen elected for 2-year terms.

County: Breckinridge County is served by a County Judge/Executive and 6 magistrates elected for 4-year terms.

COMMUNICATIONS:

Telephone: South Central Bell Telephone Company serves Hardinsburg and Cloverport. Irvington is served by the Brandenburg Telephone Company.

Telegraph: The nearest Western Union office is at Owensboro, 45 miles from Hardinsburg. Messages may be sent via a toll free number.

Newspaper: Breckinridge County Herald News is published weekly, at Hardinsburg, and has a circulation of 5,000.

Radio: WHIC-AM and FM is located in Hardinsburg.

OTHER LOCAL FACILITIES:

Hospitals: Breckinridge Memorial Hospital is located in Hardinsburg; facilities include 45 beds.

Churches: Most major denominations are located in Hardinsburg, Cloverport and Irvington.

Financial Institutions: The Farmers Bank, a branch of First State Bank, and First Federal Savings and Loan Association of Leitchfield are located in Hardinsburg. Breckinridge Bank of Cloverport is located in Cloverport. First State Bank and a branch of The Farmers Bank are located in Irvington.
