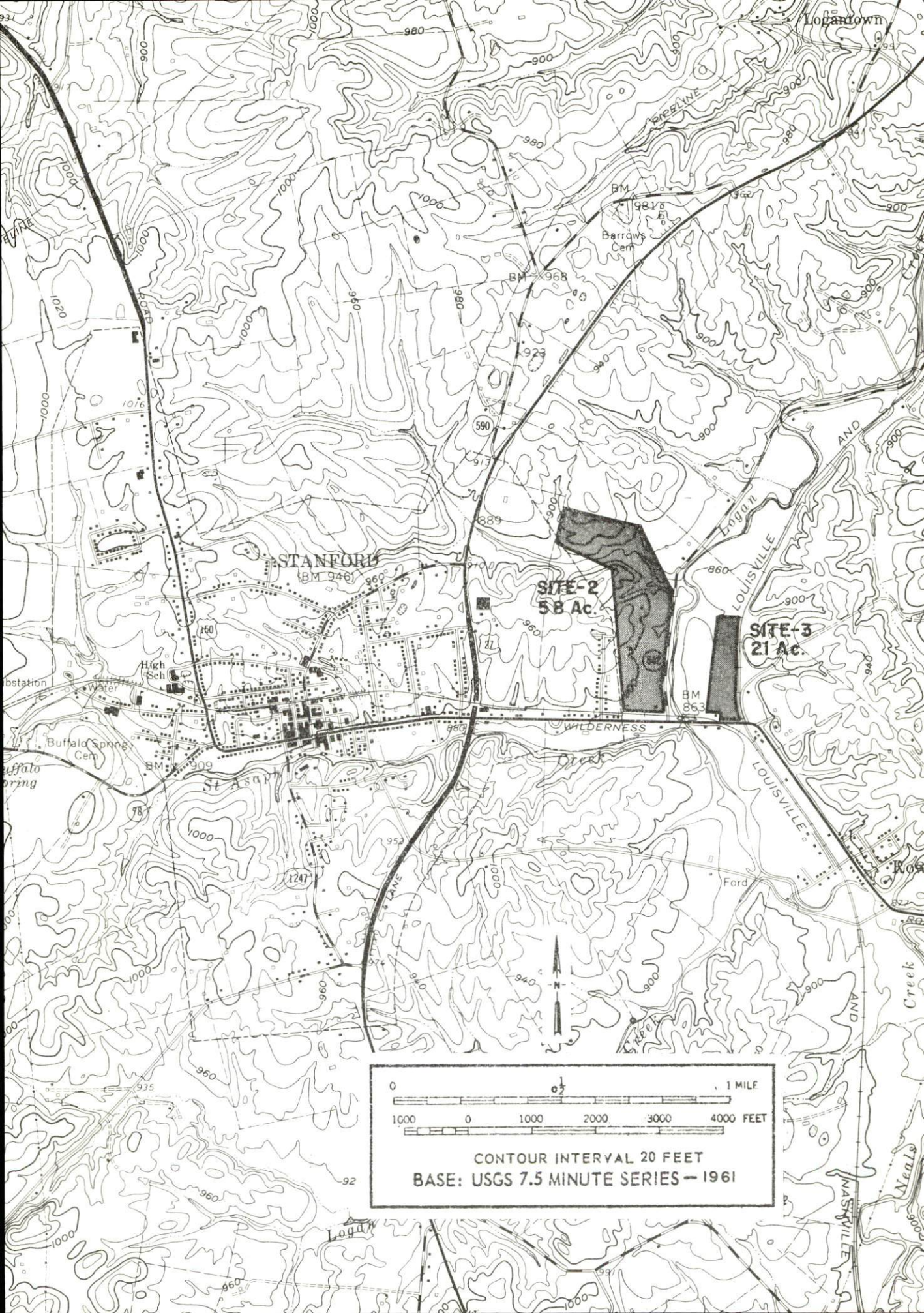

- SITE #2: ACREAGE: 58 acres  
LOCATION: Western boundary borders city limits.  
ZONING: Industrial  
HIGHWAY ACCESS: Kentucky 642 borders site on east.  
U. S. 150 is within 200 feet of southern boundary.  
RAILROADS: Louisville & Nashville Railroad bounds site on south.  
WATER: City of Stanford Water Works  
SIZE LINE: 6-inch line along south and east boundary;  
12-inch line 500 feet to northwest  
GAS: Western Kentucky Gas Company  
SIZE MAIN: 4-inch main 1,000 feet west of site

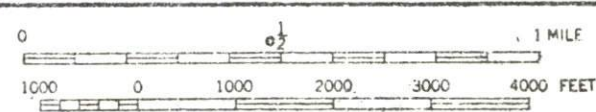

## Water and Sewerage

Water: Daily treatment capacity - 900,000 gallons; average daily use - 250,000 gallons; maximum daily use - 371,500 gallons; storage capacity - 800,000 gallons; size distribution lines - 4, 6, 8, and 12 inches.

Sewerage: Type treatment - aeration, clarifier, drying beds; design capacity - 500,000 gallons per day or a population of 4,000; size of sewer mains - 8, 10, and 12 inches.

## Local Government

Fees and licenses - Privilege licenses range from \$15.50 to \$35.50 per year.
