

Water and Sewerage

<u>Water</u>: Daily treatment capacity - 900,000 gallons; average daily use - 250,000 gallons; maximum daily use - 371,500 gallons; storage capacity - 800,000 gallons; size distribution lines - 4, 6, 8, and 12 inches.

<u>Sewerage</u>: Type treatment - aeration, clarifier, drying beds; design capacity - 500,000 gallons per day or a population of 4,000; size of sewer mains - 8, 10, and 12 inches.
