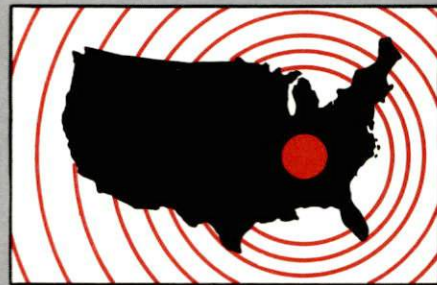

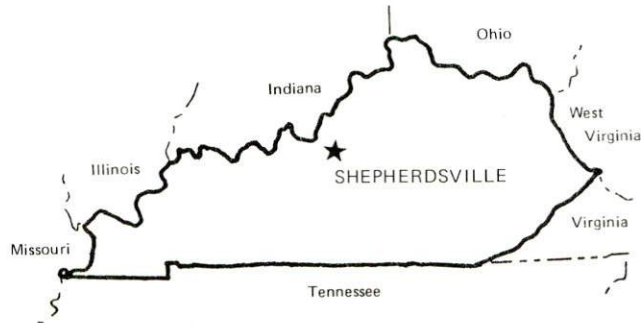

TRANSPORTATION:

Rail: The Louisville & Nashville Railroad serves Shepherdsville and Lebanon Junction with daily freight service. Nearest piggyback service is at Louisville.

Highways: I-65, a primary north-south route, bypasses Shepherdsville and Lebanon Junction and is within 10 miles of Mt. Washington. I-64, at Louisville, provides a major east-west highway.

Truck: Overnite Trucking Company and Distillery Transfer Service, Inc., serve Shepherdsville, Mt. Washington and Lebanon Junction. In addition, Shepherdsville is served by Cooper-Jarrett; Mt. Washington by Interstate Systems; and Lebanon Junction by McLean Trucking Company.

Water: The nearest navigable river is the Ohio River at Louisville where a 9-foot navigation channel is maintained.

Air: Standiford Field in Louisville, 15 miles from Shepherdsville, is the nearest commercial airport. TWA, American, Eastern, Delta, Piedmont, Ozark, Allegheny and Air Kentucky airlines serve the field.

UTILITIES:

Electricity: Louisville Gas and Electric Company and Salt River RECC serve Shepherdsville and Mt. Washington and Salt River RECC also serves Bullitt County. Kentucky Utilities Company serves Lebanon Junction and Bullitt County.

Natural Gas: Shepherdsville and Mt. Washington are served by Louisville Gas and Electric Company; their source of supply is Texas Gas Transmission Corporation. Lebanon Junction does not have natural gas service.

Other Fuels: Propane is available from nine distributors in the area and fuel oil from four distributors located in Shepherdsville and Mt. Washington.

WATER AND SEWERAGE:

Water: Shepherdsville is served by The Shepherdsville Water Works with the Salt River as the source of supply. The treatment plant capacity is 644,000 gallons per day (23 hours pumping). Average daily consumption is 270,000 gallons and peak daily consumption is 310,000 gallons. Storage capacity is 150,000 gallons.

Mt. Washington is served by the Mt. Washington Water Company which purchases treated water from the Louisville Water Company. Average daily consumption is 250,000 gallons and peak daily consumption is 310,000 gallons. Storage capacity is 300,000 gallons.

Lebanon Junction is served by the Lebanon Junction Water Works with the Rolling Fork River as the source of supply. The treatment plant capacity is 230,000 gallons per day*. Average daily consumption is 120,000 gallons and peak daily consumption is 240,000 gallons. Storage capacity is 110,000 gallons.

Sewerage: Shepherdsville is served by the Shepherdsville Sewer Works. The sewage treatment plant has a design capacity of 300,000 gallons per day. Average daily flow is 180,000 gallons and treatment is partial primary and secondary.

The company providing sewerage service to Mt. Washington is the Mt. Washington Water Pollution Control System. The sewage treatment plant has a design capacity of 400,000 gallons per day. Average daily flow is 160,000 gallons and treatment is secondary.

Lebanon Junction is served by the Lebanon Junction Sewage Treatment Plant. The sewage treatment plant has a design capacity of 280,000 gallons per day. Average daily flow is 110,000 gallons and treatment is primary and secondary.

GOVERNMENT STRUCTURE:

City: Shepherdsville, Mt. Washington, and Lebanon Junction each have a mayor with a 4-year term and 6 councilmen with 2-year terms.

County: A county judge with a 4-year term and 4 magistrates with 4-year terms serve Bullitt County.

COMMUNICATIONS:

Telephone Company: Echo Telephone Company serves Shepherdsville and Mt. Washington. Lebanon Junction is served by the South Central Bell Telephone Company.

Newspaper: The Pioneer News is published in Shepherdsville weekly and has a circulation of 5,600. The Mt. Washington Star is published weekly and has a circulation of 1,700.

Television: Major networks are received from stations located in Louisville.

OTHER LOCAL FACILITIES:

Hospitals: Excellent major medical facilities are available in Louisville, 15 miles from Shepherdsville, 14 miles from Mt. Washington, and 28 miles from Lebanon Junction.

Churches: Churches of eight major denominations are located in Shepherdsville, Mt. Washington, and Lebanon Junction.

Financial Institutions: The Peoples Bank of Mt. Washington serves Mt. Washington; Shepherdsville is served by The Bullitt County Bank and The Peoples Bank; and Lebanon Junction is served by a branch of The Peoples Bank.
