

Occupational wage rates for specific industries are usually not available to most government agencies, and wage data furnished to state employment agencies by individual industrial employers is protected from disclosure by federal law. The most reliable up-to-date wage information can be obtained by direct contact with local employers.

Associated Industries of Kentucky, a voluntary organization of Kentucky businesses, regularly collects occupational wage rates and fringe benefits data from participating member firms. Data is compiled for over 127 clearly defined office, production, and service occupations. Tabulations are published for eleven regions of Kentucky, as shown on the map below. It should be noted that the data may be weighted by the preponderance of firms in the larger cities and may be somewhat higher than the rates paid in the smaller communities. Data from these tabulations are available, upon request, from the Kentucky Department of Commerce, Frankfort, Kentucky 40601.

Property Taxes

All property in Kentucky is assessed at 100 percent of fair cash value.

Land and buildings are taxed by the state and may be taxed by local jurisdictions. The state rate is \$0.279 per \$100 of assessed valuation.

Manufacturing machinery, raw materials inventories, pollution control equipment, and goods in the process of manufacture are not subject to local taxation. The state rate is \$0.15 per \$100.

Other tangible personal property owned by manufacturers (automobiles, trucks, finished goods, office furniture, office equipment) is taxed by the state at \$0.45 per \$100 and may be taxed by local jurisdictions.

Property stored in public warehouses in a transit status is not subject to local taxation. The state rate is only \$0.015 per \$100.

Intangible personal property located in Kentucky (money in hand, shares of stock, notes, bonds, accounts receivable, and other credits) is taxed by the state at \$0.25 per \$100, and is not subject to local taxation.

Private leaseholds in industrial facilities owned by cities or counties and financed by industrial revenue bonds are subject to a state tax of \$0.015 per \$100 of value (essentially the lessee's equity, adjusted for appreciation or depreciation). Local taxation is not permitted.

RECREATION

Greensburg has a 65-acre community park which has been developed and financed by local residents. The park has a swimming pool, ball fields, air-conditioned dining room, pavillion, fishing area, horse show ring, horseshoe pits, tennis courts, picnic area, equipped playground, and croquet court. Four other tennis courts are located at the elementary school.

Other recreational opportunities in Green County are provided by a 9-hole golf course, an archery range, the Green County Sportsman Club, the Green County Saddle Club, a drive-in movie theater, and two skating rinks.

Greensburg is the location of the annual Mid-Kentucky State Appaloosa Horse Show and annual 25-mile Green River Canoe Race.

Many historical and architectural points of interest are located in Green County. Greensburg has the oldest courthouse west of the Alleghenies. The building was started in 1799 and completed four years later. The two-story structure has recently been renovated and is now open to the public. Other points of interest include the home of Jeremiah Abell, Presbyterian minister who served as missionary and pastor in Green and surrounding counties during the early 1800's; the site of the home of Jane Todd Crawford on whom Dr. Ephraim McDowell performed the first successful ovariotomy in 1809; General E.H. Hobson's Home; a Court Clerk's office built in 1818; a water powered sawmill; Mt. Gilead Church which is built on the site of the camp of the "Long Hunters" who came to Kentucky in 1769; the Old Bank Building which originally housed the Bank of Kentucky; Old Vaughn or Allen's Inn; Pendleton House; Ben Will Penick House; Shreve House, which originally housed the Greensburg Academy; and Simpson House, the birthplace of Abraham Lincoln's law partner.

Area (Within 40 miles)

Just 10 miles to the east of Greensburg is the Green River Lake State Park. Located on the shore of an 8,200-acre lake, the park area encompasses 1,300 acres. Facilities and activities at the park include a marina, a restaurant, swimming, boating, camping and picnicking.

Lake Cumberland, one of Kentucky's largest lakes, is located 38 miles south of Greensburg. Known for its productive fishing and the beauty of the area, the lake is a favorite vacation spot. A state resort park located on the lake offers extensive recreational facilities which include lodging, dining, camping, picnicking, biking, horseback riding, fishing, tennis, hiking, golf, miniature golf, boat rentals, a resort pool and an Olympic pool, a gift shop, a nature center, a playground, and a multi-purpose convention center.

Abraham Lincoln Birthplace National Historical Site near Hodgenville, is a 116-acre site which includes the original log cabin where Lincoln was born. Nearby is Abraham Lincoln's Boyhood Home, the site of Lincoln's last home in Kentucky.

Greensburg is located just east of one of the largest cave networks ever discovered. Mammoth Cave National Park is comprised of 51,000 acres, most of which are in their natural state. The park provides a variety of cave tours, nature trails, camping, fishing, scenic boat trips, lodging, a restaurant and coffee shop. Other attractions in the cave area include the Barren River Lake State Resort Park, state shrines, historical sites, chair lifts, museums, craft shops, gift shops and a professional theater.

COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENTS

The Greensburg City Council passed a major annexation ordinance in the spring of 1979. Five sections of property, which increase the land area of Greensburg by approximately 50 percent, were annexed.

A convention center and sewer facilities have been added to the city park. The convention center will seat 800-1,000 people and contains kitchen facilities, meeting rooms, a recreational room and auditorium. The all-purpose building, which was completed in early 1979, is airconditioned and heated and hosts a complete sound system. It cost approximately \$150,000.

The Green-Taylor Water District is undergoing a major expansion. Sixty-five miles of water lines are being added at a cost of \$1,718,500. The expansion will almost double the number of customers served.

City officials have purchased approximately two acres of land to be used as lagoons for the Greensburg Water Works. Plans are being drawn and officials hope to have the lagoons in operation by July 1980.

The Greensburg Sewer System is currently doing the Smoke Test of the 201 Facilities Plan.

The Green-Taylor County Railroad Authority was formed in the spring of 1979 to attempt to retain the L & N Railroad line into Greensburg.

The Industrial Foundation has been reactivated and has become involved in the "Save the Railroad" endeavor.

The Greensburg-Green County Planning and Zoning Commission was reactivated in September 1978 and now has jurisdiction five miles beyond the city limits.

A substation of the Kentucky Utilities Company has been enlarged and the size of the lines have been increased to increase capacity availabilities by approximately 15 percent.

Three one-lane bridges in Green County are being replaced. One on Kentucky Highway 218 is complete, one on U.S. Highway 68 is under construction, and one on Kentucky Highway 88 over the Green River is in the preliminary stages and is scheduled to be completed in June 1980.

Several local companies have recently expanded. The Greensburg Manufacturing Company has recently undergone a \$1 million expansion. Clark Casual Furniture, Inc., and the Greensburg Bottling Company have also recently expanded and/or remodeled.

The Green County Fiscal Court has purchased \$75,000 worth of road equipment for the county road department. The main purchase was a road grader.

Plans are being made to upgrade the courtroom facilities in the Green County Courthouse. Approval has been received to advertise for bids for an estimated \$40,000 worth of work to be completed in the spring of 1980.

The Green County Division of the Lake Cumberland Emergency Medical Service System plans to obtain a second life support unit and plans to hire several emergency medical technicians.

The Old Bank Building on the Greensburg Square was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in the spring of 1979. The Old Courthouse, the first courthouse west of the Allegheny Mountains, and the Greensburg Academy are also on the National Register of Historic Places.
