Linda served her first three months and then was elected by the members to serve them for the following year. Under Linda's leadership the chapter earned the Banner and Standard Achievement Awards in only four months and was recognized at the National Convention held in Minneapolis, Minnesota in October of 1964 for this accomplishment. In October of 1965 we received the Banner Medallion and the Standard of Achievement Awards. These awards are not earned without hard work and strong leadership, Linda has given both. In 1965 she received the chapter's Merit Award and, also, her perfect attendance award. Since her term of office expired, Linda has actively served as Membership Chairman and she will, also, be our Spring Hand of Friendship Tea Chairman.

Linda is employed by the Bowling Green City School System as supervisor of the Bowling Green High School Cafeteria. Linda is a member of the Glendale Baptist Church where she takes an active part in the program of her church. Outside of all of her other activities Linda has a family of four and a husband to care for. Congratulations, Linda, on being elected our 1966 WOMAN OF THE YEAR!

All are to be completed between the dates of September 26, 1965 and September 25, 1966.

1. Boss Night Dinner.

4. Publication of nine or more issues of a chapter bulletin.
