Water: Daily treatment capacity - 200,000 gallons and also purchases 80,000 gallons of treated water per month from the Barbourville Water and Electric Company; peak daily use - 90,000 gallons; size distribution lines - 8, 6, 4, 3 and 2 inches

 Outside corporate limits - 75 percent of monthly water bill
